

Dear Ms. Quackenbush:

Thank you for forwarding me copies of resolutions adopted on February 14 addressing various concerns of the Town of Warwick including: support of Assembly bills A88 and A824; and support of the Second Amendment.

Regarding Assembly bill A88, which requires plaintiffs in mortgage foreclosure actions to provide contact information, please be advised a "same as" bill was introduced in the Senate. Senate Bill S3655 is currently in the Senate Housing, Construction and Community Development Committee. As a co-sponsor of this bill, I will vote in favor of it and urge my colleagues to do the same. Assembly bill A824, which requires a plaintiff in a mortgage foreclosure action to maintain the subject property in good faith, currently has no "same as" bill in the Senate. Should this bill be introduced and come before me, I will certainly take your concerns into consideration.

Relating to your resolution on the Second Amendment, I agree. As you may be aware, I voted "no" on Governor Cuomo's so-called "SAFE" (Secure Ammunition Firearms Enforcement) gun legislation, Senate Bill S2230. This legislation was pushed through the state legislature through a "message of necessity" issued by the Governor, thereby ignoring the public process. This issue should have been part of public hearings and debate since gun legislation is a very complex issue that many people are very passionate about. We should not have rushed into any measure that impacts our Second Amendment rights. I voted no on this bill because it trampled on our Second Amendment rights; it was not tough enough on criminals and illegal guns; it places unnecessary restrictions on law-abiding gun owners; and it is not strong enough on mental health issues. I fought to go after the real root of the gun violence problem - illegal guns - which make up ninety percent of gun crimes in New York City and seventy percent of gun crimes across New York State. I stood up for the people in my district who wanted me to protect their right to own a gun for hunting, target shooting and personal protection.

Thank you for keeping me informed of issues concerning the Town of Warwick. Please feel free to contact my office if I can be of further assistance to you.






Dear Mr. Sweeton,
