**LEGAL NOTICE: The Clerk read the legal notice, which was duly published in the Warwick Valley Dispatch on July 1, 2016. (Copy of this legal notice is printed at the end of these minutes.)**

**Supervisor Sweeton – For the public's information this is an annual requirement the New York State DEC has established what they call MS4 areas around the state and ours is in the area of the town surrounding Greenwood Lake. The purpose of these zones for the municipality to take responsibility for monitoring discharges to the lake to prevent pollution and also to have a plan of educating and informing the public the hazards of illicit dumping and also monitoring development sites for illicit disturbances. We file this report every year and there are five sections to it, again the education component, the development component, the illicit discharge component and we measure ourselves year to year on how we are monitoring and performing. This report has been published on our website and it's been available for review. We continue to make progress and work with the Groundwater Guardian Program, in our schools we also do notices of hazardous collections days and notices in our newspaper, we monitor all of our outflows that have been mapped and enter the Greenwood Lake basin to make sure they are clean and free of debris our highway department does that. We also have a program for how we dispose of materials here at town hall and in our DPW operation. We work with the Chamber of Commerce on Operation Clean Sweep on the roadside clean sweep, we do sweeping of our own roads and our parking lots. We work hand and hand with the Village of Greenwood Lake on their efforts. That is the gist of the report and that is due to be filed with the New York State DEC and this is a hearing on that report this evening.**
