COUNCILMAN DE ANGELO REPORT

1. The Warwick Valley Humane Society is having a Feline Frenzy Cat Clearance Sale. All adult cats one year of age and older is \$25 for approved applicants from now until June 30th. Special needs cats including prescription diets, seniors and long term residents are free with approved applications. They have 130 cats there so you have a lot to choose from. They also need donations of bleach, paper towels, dish detergent, heavy duty garage bags, large dog biscuits and canned pate cat food and no dry food.

Police Chief McGovern – I would like to give Officer Halsey and his K-9 partner Nikki a commendation for a burglary that occurred the other night at a construction trailer in the Village of Warwick on Orchard Street. Someone heard it and called the police. The perpetrator took off running from the cops onto the golf course and the dog got him. We recovered all the stolen property and he has been arrested. It's just another example showing the value of these dogs and it's unbelievable what they can do.

COUNCILMAN KOWAL REPORT

1. We had a generous donation of some fill and we are going to add another athletic field in the back by the dog park at the Union Corners Park. It's in the process of being filled in and we will get it graded off and let it settle for a while. When it's the appropriate time we can seed it and hopefully put that in service next year. Bill is working on a new roof on the pavilion at Union Corners Park. We have a new barricade at the beach for when the lifeguards aren't there and the beach is closed.

PRIVILEGE OF THE FLOOR (GENERAL)

Richard Murtie – Resident, Town of Warwick, NY 10990 – Mr. Shuback was saying that they were cutting trees on Ackerman Road. What is the town setback from the edge of the road to the center of the road?

Supervisor Sweeton – 25 feet from the center of the road

Richard Murtie – And those trees that were...

Supervisor Sweeton – If they're in the right-of-way.

Richard Murtie – People just aren't aware of what the right-of-way is and what is their own property.

Supervisor Sweeton – A lot of the deeds go to the center of the road. By highway law. The town has the right to maintain its right-of-way. People just sometimes don't understand it and it creates confusion.

Everett Cox – Resident, Town of Warwick, NY 10990 – I want to let the Board know about a new program for Veterans in Orange County called the Joseph P. Dwyer Peer Support Program. Joseph Dwyer was an army medic surgeon in Iraq and came home with PTSD and ended up overdosing on drugs leaving behind a widow and a little girl. The Joseph P. Dwyer Program started on Long Island and now has expanded to 12 counties. I'm starting this year in Orange County myself along with a young woman, an Air Force Vet. We are both part time and we have one full time coordinator. The program is open to all Veterans from any era of service, branch of service and any type of discharge. We have started with three programs in Middletown, Newburgh and Port Jervis. These are weekly meetings open to Vets and we will be expanding as we develop. As one Veteran has said, it would be useful to have these in every town and village. Veterans are welcome to come and discuss anything of importance to them. It maybe personal, it could be housing, employment, substance abuse and it could be suicide. We don't solve these problems. We have many resources with the Orange County Veterans Services and the Hudson Valley VA System so we can do those referrals. We are also working with the Vet Center in Middletown and I have fliers for each of you. If you have any questions I will be happy to take them.

Supervisor Sweeton – Are the meeting dates and times and places available? We can promote it on our channel.

Everett Cox – I will get those to you. There is an evening meeting on Monday's in Middletown at the Thrall Library but I will get the specifics to you.

Supervisor Sweeton – That would be great and we will publicize it as soon as we can.

Richard Moake – Representative, Watchtower Bible and Tract Society of New York, Inc. – Is it appropriate to ask a question on the resolution you just passed, which we of course very much appreciate. Discussing them with Mr. Bollenbach and Mr. Nichol I had the impression that maybe you would also be considering the approval of a replacement.

Supervisor Sweeton – We did. At the end it read to the satisfaction of the Town Attorney.

Richard Moake – Oh ok, I didn't hear the replacement part.

Supervisor Sweeton – Yes, we did.

Richard Moake – Sorry.
