The Post Report for September 2023 is as follows: Greenwood Lake had 163 calls, the Town outside the Village had 557 calls, Pine Island had 249 calls, the Village of Warwick had 492 calls and the Greenwood Lake Volunteer Ambulance District had 51 calls for a total of 1,512 for the month of September.
