INTRODUCTORY LOCAL LAW NO. 6 OF 2022

A LOCAL LAW ENTITLED "A LOCAL LAW ESTABLISHING A SIX-MONTH MORATORIUM PROHIBITING THE REVIEW AND APPROVAL OF SHORT-TERM RENTAL PERMIT APPLICATIONS IN THE TOWN OF WARWICK"

Be it enacted by the Town Board of the Town of Warwick, County of Orange, State of New York as follows:

Section 1. Title.

This Local Law shall be referred to as "A LOCAL LAW ESTABLISHING A SIX-MONTH MORATORIUM PROHIBITING THE REVIEW AND APPROVAL OF SHORT-TERM RENTAL PERMIT APPLICATIONS IN THE TOWN OF WARWICK".

Section 2. Definitions.

"Code" means the "Code of the Town of Warwick".

"Town" means the Town of Warwick.

"Town Board" means the Town Board of the Town of Warwick.

"Town Clerk" means the Town Clerk of the Town of Warwick.

"Short-Term Rental Law" means Chapter 129 of the Code of the Town of Warwick.

Section 3. Legislative Findings, Purpose and Intent.

The Town Board has determined that the Short-Term Rental Law as written has not proven sufficient to oversee the use of private residences and other qualifying properties as Short-Term rental units, and as such law needs to provide for new circumstances not addressed by the current law, certain revisions to the Short-Term Rental Law may be required.

Pursuant to the statutory powers vested in the Town to protect the health, safety and welfare of its residents, the Town Board of the Town of Warwick hereby declares a six-month moratorium on the submission and processing of any applications of Short-Term Rental permits pursuant to applicable provisions of the Short-Term Rental Law pending the Town Board's completion and adoption of certain amendments to the Short-Term Rental Law that through their review are found to be necessary to better implement the purpose and intent of said law.

Section 4. Scope of Controls

A. During the effective period of this Local Law:

- 1. No applications for Short-Term Rental permits or applications for renewal of existing Short-Term Rental permits shall be accepted or processed by any Departments of the Town, and no such permits shall be issued by the Town as provided for in the Short-Term Rental Law.
- 2. Short-Term Rental permits in existence at the effective date of this Local Law shall remain in effect and be entitled to renewal pursuant to Section 129-4 of the Short-Term Rental Law. Such existing permits and any extensions thereof shall operate in compliance with the Short-Term Rental Law as currently written.

Section 5. Term.

The moratorium imposed by this Local Law shall be in effect for six (6) months from the effective date of this Local Law.

Section 7. Penalties.

Any person, firm or entity that operates a Short-Term Rental property without a permit issued prior to the effective date of this Local Law or shall otherwise violate any of the provisions of this Local Law shall be subject to:

- A. Such penalties as may otherwise be provided by applicable local laws, ordinances, rules, regulations of the Town for violations; and
- B. A fine not to exceed \$500.00 per day from the date that any action is taken in contravention of this local law, together with any other civil remedies available at law; and
- C. Injunctive relief in favor of the Town to cease any and all such actions which conflict with this Local Law and, if necessary, to remove any construction that may have taken place in violation of this Local Law.

Any application accepted or approval granted in violation of this Local Law shall be null and void.

Section 9. Severability.

If any part or provision of this Local Law or the application thereof to any person or circumstance be adjudged invalid by any court of competent jurisdiction, such judgment shall be confined in its operation to the part or provision or application directly involved in the controversy in which such judgment shall have been rendered and shall not affect or impair the validity of the remainder of this Local Law or the application thereof to other persons or circumstances, and the Town Board of the Town of Warwick hereby declares that it would have passed this Local Law or the remainder thereof had such invalid application or invalid provision been apparent.

Section 10. Repeal.

All ordinances, local laws and parts thereof inconsistent with this Local Law are hereby repealed.

Section 11. Effective Date.

This Local Law shall take effect immediately upon filing in the office of the New York State Secretary of State in accordance with section 27 of the Municipal Home Rule Law.
