This service is available to everyone in the Warwick Valley, and covers items such as refrigerators, window air conditioners, dehumidifiers, water coolers, and mini-fridges. We'll also accept canisters of refrigerants.



This year the refrigerant recovery work will be performed pro bono by Hudson Technologies, one of the largest refrigerant reclaimers in the United States.

Let us help you safely recycle your refrigerant-containing appliances and protect the planet!



We want to help everyone properly recycle their refrigerant-containing appliances.

The chemicals used as refrigerants are engineered and industrially produced to be able to transfer heat when trapped in a pressurized system. When these chemicals are released into the atmosphere, they become greenhouse gases that are thousands of times more powerful than carbon dioxide. The refrigerant used in most window air conditioners is R410A. If 2.5 pounds of R410A are released to the atmosphere, over the next 20 years they will act like 11,000 pounds of carbon dioxide, or roughly the same emissions of driving the average car for a full year. A single air conditioner can hold up to 2 pounds of R410A, so we want to help everyone properly recycle their refrigerant-containing appliances.

We offer this service for free, but gladly accept donations.
