Hon. Michael Sweeton and all Town Board Members.

I am an attorney and resident of Warwick and am also a Parishioner and a Trustee of St. Stephen the First Martyr Roman Catholic Church. I have been asked by Fr. Reynor Santiago, who is currently the administrator of St. Stephen as well as for both St. Joseph Church in Florida and St. Stanislaus Church in Pine Island, to make an application on behalf of St. Stanislaus in connection for a lot line change to benefit the St. Stanislaus Cemetery in Pine Island.

St. Stanislaus is the owner of the St. Stanislaus Cemetery, located on the Northwest Corner of County Route 1 and Pulaski Highway, lot 13-1-17. Access to the cemetery is currently obtained via a driveway behind the CYO building on County Route 1 which crosses over lands currently owned by Philip Hamling (13-1-1.4) and the Morgiewicz Living Trust (13-1-1.1). In addition, the septic field servicing the CYO building actually extends onto the Hamling parcel and onto the Trust parcel. Both Mr. Hamling and the Trust have agreed to convey a portion of their respective properties to St. Stanislaus so that the driveway providing access to the cemetery, and the entire area of the septic field, would be owned by St. Stanislaus and become part of the cemetery. The Trust has also agreed to convey a small portion of its property to Mr. Hamling that is adjoining the Hamling parcel and which is only accessible by the Trust by way of an easement over the Hamling parcel.

In order to achieve the foregoing, I am preparing a Sketch Plan Application and Minor Subdivision Application to the Town Planning Board and am working with John Robert Nelting Surveying and Mapping, PLLC. I expect these applications to be submitted shortly and in time for the Planning Board's scheduled March 20, 2023 meeting. In this regard, I am donating my time and am prepared to personally cover the costs for the application and for the preparation and recording of the deeds to accomplish the conveyance. Mr. Nelting has also graciously agreed to donate his time and services as well. Accordingly, I respectfully request that the Town Board agree to waive the Town's application fees associated with these applications. I understand that the Town cannot waive the escrow account for consultant review and I will advance the required escrow on behalf of St. Stanislaus.
