CONDITIONALLY EXEMPT SMALL QUANTITY GENERATOR CERTIFICATION

I hereby certify that I am a generator of hazardous waste within the State of New York and that because of the small volume of hazardous waste generated and/or stored, I qualify for conditionally exempt small quantity generator status.

I understand that in order for conditionally exempt small quantity generator status, I must meet all three of the following conditions:

- 1. Generate less than 1 kg/month (2.2 pounds) of acute hazardous waste (as defined by 6 NYCRR Part 371), and never store more than this amount on site at any time; and
- 2. Generate less than 100 kg/month (220 pounds) of all other hazardous waste (as defined by 6 NYCRR Part 371), and never store more than 1000 kg/month on site at any time.
- 3. Transport a maximum of 220 lbs of hazardous waste at one time.

Only if I am a farmer, I realize that I may store up to 1000 kg. (2200 pounds) of non-acute hazardous waste pesticides on my farm without losing my conditionally exempt status, provided that these wastes are brought to a household hazardous waste collection program.

I further understand that if, in the future, I exceed the quantity limitations described above, I will become subject to additionally regulation as a hazardous waste generator and will no longer be eligible to participate in this type of collection program.

I certify that I have the authority to make these statements on behalf of my farm or business. Also, I, the undersigned, do hereby certify that the items brought for collection came from my farm or business located in Orange County.

ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF WEST MILFORD, COUNTY OF PASSAIC, STATE OF NEW JERSEY AMENDING CHAPTER 500 "ZONING" TO ADD SECTION 500-92 "EMERGENCY STANDBY GENERATORS" TO CLARIFY SITING FOR PERMANENT EMERGENCY STANDBY GENERATORS OF THE REVISED GENERAL ORDINANCES OF THE TOWNSHIP

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Township Council determined setback requirements for the siting of emergency standby generators is unclear in the Township Code; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Township Council wish to clarify the ordinance provisions for emergency standby generators on residential and commercial lots; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Township Council have determined that clarifying the ordinance would be beneficial to the general welfare of the community, particular in protecting the public during emergency power outages.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Township Council of the Township of West Milford, in the County of Passaic, and State of New Jersey as follows:

SECTION 1. Chapter 500 "Zoning" Section 500-92 Emergency Standby Generators is added to read as follows:

§ 500-92. Emergency standby generators.

- A. The purpose of this section is to establish guidelines for siting permanent emergency standby generators to ensure their safe operation and prevent a nuisance to neighboring properties. This section shall apply to residential uses.
- B. As used in this section, the following terms shall have the meanings indicated: **EMERGENCY**

Loss of power due to a power outage outside of the owner's control.

EMERGENCY STANDBY GENERATOR

A fuel-powered generator which is permanently connected to the electrical system of a structure and primarily operates in the event of a power outage in order to provide backup power. In the event of a power outage emergency standby generators automatically turn on, or are switched on by the owner and supply power. Once utility power is restored, the generator automatically transfers the electrical load back to the utilities or is manually switched off and power is turned back to the utilities. Emergency standby generators are also operated occasionally for maintenance purposes.

PORTABLE GENERATOR

Is not permanently connected to a building's electrical system, uses a self-contained fuel source and is portable for storage. Portable generators shall be outside when they are being utilized in the event of a power outage emergency or occasionally for maintenance purposes, and are not required to obtain approval pursuant to this section.

- C. Siting and placement requirements for all generators.
 - (1) Emergency standby generators shall be considered minor accessory structures (if less than 25 kW in size) and must adhere to the requirements for minor accessory structures as set forth in § 500-92.1C. If the generator is larger than 25 kW, standard accessory structure standards apply.
 - (2) Generator placement must adhere to manufacturer guidelines.
- D. Permits.
 - (1) All applicants for an emergency standby generator must submit a Zoning Permit Application. The application must include a site drawing on a raised-seal survey showing the proposed location of the standby generator and associated setbacks to all adjacent property lines. Noise in decibels based on distance from the unit must also be provided.

- (2) Residential and non-residential applicants for an emergency standby generator with a maximum energy output of more than 25 kW shall submit an application for a minor site plan with the Planning Board, unless the generator is proposed in conjunction with a major site plan application.
- E. Time of use regulations.
 - (1) Unlimited use during an emergency.
 - (2) Exercise of the generator is permitted as required for maintenance, but not more than once a week, on weekdays, between the hours of 10:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. and not to exceed 30 minutes at a time.
- F. Screening.
 - (1) Screening of the unit is required, if visible from any right-of-way or adjacent properties.
 - (2) Natural screening shall be used wherever possible.
 - (3) If, due to the characteristics of the given lot, natural screening is not possible, fences conforming to § 500-68 are permitted.
- G. Noise attenuation.
 - (1) Generator operating sound output may not exceed the New Jersey Noise Control Act (N.J.S.A. 13:1G-1) as measured from the closest property line.
 - Sound attenuation enclosures, screening and landscaping may be used to minimize noise on adjacent properties and bring noise output into compliance with the standards of the New Jersey Noise Control Act (N.J.S.A. 13:1G-1).
- H. Fuel storage.
 - (1) If a generator is utilizing diesel fuel, the fuel storage tank shall be double-walled.
- I. Regulatory compliance.
 - (1) Emergency standby generators shall be installed and operated in accordance with manufacturer's requirements as well as all federal, state and local codes, whichever is most stringent.
- J. Application fee. Every application for the installation of a permanent standby generator shall be accompanied by a fee of \$40, which shall be separate from and in addition to any other zoning and building permit fees.
- K. Violations and penalties. Any person, firm, corporation or entity which shall violate any provision of this section shall, upon conviction, be subject to a fine not exceeding \$500, and each day that such violation continues shall be deemed a separate offense.
- All ordinances of the Township of West Milford, which are inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance, are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.
- SECTION 3. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance is for any reason held to be unconstitutional or invalid, such decision shall not affect the remaining portions of this Ordinance.
- **SECTION 4.** This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon final passage, approval, and publication as required by law.
- **SECTION 5.** This Ordinance may be renumbered for codification purposes.

ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF WEST MILFORD, COUNTY OF PASSAIC, STATE OF NEW JERSEY TO CREATE A NEW SECTION WITHIN CHAPTER 500 "ZONING" AND PROHIBITING THE GIFTING OF CANNABIS

WHEREAS, in 2020 New Jersey voters approved Public Question No. 1, which amended the New Jersey Constitution to allow for the legalization of a controlled form of marijuana called "cannabis" for adults at least 21 years of age; and

WHEREAS, on February 22, 2021, Governor Murphy signed into law P.L. 2021, c.16, known as the "New Jersey Cannabis Regulatory, Enforcement Assistance, and Marketplace Modernization Act," N.J.S.A. 24:6I-31 et seq. (the "Act"), which legalizes the recreational use of marijuana by adults 21 years of age or older, and establishes a comprehensive regulatory and licensing scheme for commercial recreational (adult use) cannabis operations, use and possession; and

WHEREAS, the Act establishes the following six marketplace classes of business licenses to be issued by the State of New Jersey Cannabis Regulatory Commission for the legal operation of cannabis establishments and other types of cannabis marketplace activity in the State, including:

- Class 1 Cannabis Cultivator license, for facilities involved in growing and cultivating cannabis;
- Class 2 Cannabis Manufacturer license, for facilities involved in the manufacturing, preparation, and packaging of cannabis items;
- Class 3 Cannabis Wholesaler license, for facilities involved in obtaining and selling cannabis items for later resale by other licensees;
- Class 4 Cannabis Distributer license, for businesses involved in transporting cannabis plants in bulk from one licensed cultivator to another licensed cultivator, or cannabis items in bulk from any type of licensed cannabis business to another;
- Class 5 Cannabis Retailer license for locations at which cannabis items and related supplies are sold to consumers; and
- Class 6 Cannabis Delivery license, for businesses providing courier services for consumer purchases that are fulfilled by a licensed cannabis retailer in order to make deliveries of the purchased items to a consumer, and which service would include the ability of a consumer to make a purchase directly through the licensed cannabis delivery service which would be presented by the delivery service for fulfillment by a retailer and then delivered to a consumer.

WHEREAS, section 31a of the Act, N.J.S.A. 24:6I-45a, authorizes municipalities to adopt ordinances and regulations prohibiting outright and/or limiting the number of any class of license "cannabis establishments" (defined in section 33 of the Act, N.J.S.A. 24:6I-33, as "a cannabis cultivator, a cannabis manufacturer, a cannabis wholesaler, or a cannabis retailer"), cannabis distributors and cannabis delivery services allowed to operate within its municipal boundaries; and the location, manner and times of operation of such cannabis establishments, cannabis distributors and cannabis delivery services, except that the time of operations for cannabis delivery services, shall only be subject to the regulation by the Cannabis Regulatory Commission (the "Commission"); and

WHEREAS, section 31a of the Act, N.J.S.A. 24:6I-45a, also authorizes municipalities to establish certain civil penalties for violations of any ordinance or regulations governing cannabis establishments, distributors or delivery services that may operate in a municipality, as well as to their location, manner and times of operation; and

WHEREAS, section 31b of the Act, N.J.S.A. 24:61-45b, authorizes municipalities to prohibit, by ordinance, the operation of any one or more classes of cannabis establishments, cannabis distributors, and the principal premises of a cannabis delivery service from anywhere in the municipality, but not the actual delivery of cannabis items and related supplies by a licensed cannabis delivery service operating outside the boundaries of the municipality; and

WHEREAS, section 31c of the Act, N.J.S.A. 24:6I-45c, authorizes municipalities to impose a separate local licensing or endorsement requirement as part of its restrictions on the number of cannabis establishments, distributors or delivery services; and

WHEREAS, section 40 of the Act, N.J.S.A. 40:48I-1, authorizes municipalities to adopt ordinances imposing a transfer tax on the sale of cannabis or cannabis items by a cannabis establishment located in the municipality on receipts from the sale of cannabis to other cultivators, sales between cannabis establishments, and any combination thereof, and sets forth the limits for same; and

WHEREAS, the Township of West Milford has specifically allowed cultivation (Cannabis Cultivator License Class 1), manufacturing (Cannabis Manufacturer License Class 2), wholesaler (Cannabis Wholesaler License Class 3), distribution (Cannabis Cultivator License Class 4), retailer (Cannabis Retailer License Class 5) and delivery (Cannabis Deliver License Class 6) under the Act, subject to municipal regulation where appropriate in the Township; and

WHEREAS, a number of individuals, cannabis businesses and/or license holders have been engaged, as part of their business activities, in "gifting" or otherwise providing free samples of marijuana or cannabis items in violation of New Jersey consumer protection laws; and

WHEREAS, such "gifting" is not authorized by the New Jersey Cannabis Regulatory, Enforcement Assistance, and Marketplace Modernization Act, and such practice in certain carefully defined circumstances violates N.J.S.A. 2C:35-10a, a criminal statute.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED, by the Mayor and Township Council of the Township of West Milford, County of Passaic, and the State of New Jersey that the Township of West Milford Code shall be amended and updated, as follows:

SECTION 1.

Within MEDICAL AND RECREATIONAL CANNABIS ACTIVITY" of the Code of the Township of West Milford, Section 500-195 Definitions shall be amended to include the definition of "Gifting" as noted below:

"Gifting" Shall mean any individual, cannabis business or license holder providing free samples of marijuana or cannabis items, either independent of, or in connection with the sale of other goods and or services.

SECTION 2.

Section 500 of the Medical and Recreational Cannabis Activity Code shall be further amended to include the following provision, to be included as new Section 500-205, and as noted below:

Section § 500-205 Gifting Prohibited.

Under no circumstance shall any individual, cannabis business or cannabis license holder, under any class of license, engage in gifting cannabis or marijuana as defined herein. Any individual, cannabis business or cannabis license holder found in violation of this provision shall be subject to the provisions as set forth within this Chapter, including but not limited to Section 500-204 Civil Fines and Penalties, and depending upon other carefully defined circumstances, possible criminal prosecution.

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Township Council determined the maximum permitted height of fences and walls on lots in any residential district is unclear in the Township Code; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Township Council wish to clarify the ordinance provisions for the maximum height of fences and walls on lots in residential districts; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Township Council wish to clarify the ordinance definition for minor soil removal or soil fill permit; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Township Council have determined that clarifying the ordinance would be beneficial to the general welfare of the community; and

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Township Council of the Township of West Milford, in the County of Passaic, and State of New Jersey as follows:

SECTION 1. Chapter 420 "Land Use Procedures" is amended to read as follows:

§420-6. Definitions.

MINOR SOIL REMOVAL OR SOIL FILL PERMIT

A permit for the removal, fill or moving of more than 100 but less than 500 cubic yards of soil.

SECTION 2. Chapter 500 "Zoning" Section 500-68 Fences, walls and sight triangles: is amended to read as follows:

§500-68. Fences, walls and sight triangles.

- A. All permitted fences shall be situated on a lot in such a manner that the finished side of the fence shall face adjacent properties. No fence shall be erected of barbed wire, topped with metal spikes, or constructed of any material or in any manner which may be dangerous to persons or animals, except that these provisions shall not apply to farms or where necessary for the keeping of farm animals as provided in §500-90 and except further that fences permitted for commercial and industrial uses may be topped by a barbed wire protective barrier. Moreover, notwithstanding any other provisions of this section, retaining walls which are less than four feet in height, part of a larger project certified by an engineer, or on a site plan approved by the Township Engineer do not require a separate zoning or building permit application. Retaining walls which are four feet or over in height require both a zoning and building permit application. Any Township review of the submitted request shall consider the safety and aesthetic aspects of the proposed retaining wall.
- B. On any lot in any residential district, the maximum permitted height of a wall or fence is four feet in front yard areas and six feet in side or rear yard areas except:
 - (1) A private, belowground residential swimming pool area shall be surrounded by a fence at least four feet, but no more than six feet, in height. Swimming pool areas shall be located in rear or side areas only. See §500-86 for additional standards.

Mr. Sweeton,

The entire Too Good To Toss team would like to thank you for your continued support of our volunteers' efforts to keep useful goods off the street, out of the landfill, and in the hands of people who need or want them. Thanks for all your help in bringing TGTT back on the basketball court. We counted 625 shoppers and admitted (50 at a time) between 10 AM & 12:45 PM on Sunday. After that, the crowd thinned out so we opened the gates and stopped counting. Volunteers began sorting & boxing leftovers @ 4PM, but people still dropped by to shop until we closed the gates at 6PM.

All the clothing and linens, books, were taken on Sun. evening by a Warwick resident who will arrange to get them to a Haitian charity. The organizer of the St. Stephen's tag sale, and several members of her team, collected items that they could use on Monday AM. Other leftover donations were boxed and delivered, by volunteers, to private residences to be picked up by the Vietnam Vets org. The Vets won't pick up from a public place.

Monday evening, Jenc's party rental texted that all the tents, tables, and chairs were removed and the front gate to the bball court was locked. Andrew, DPW, locked the back gate by the shed Saturday eve. The front gate and gate by the creek are locked with TGTT chains & locks. I wanted the basketball court locked so that no one could get hurt rummaging through the leftover donations. Mike Moser told me, after the Salvation Army cancelled all scheduled pickups for 90 days, that the DPW would remove and dispose of all the leftover donations at no charge on Tuesday. They are gathered inside the fence - some furniture, kids toys, framed artwork, picture frames and mirrors- on the grass. TGTT team sorted recycables - cardboard, paper, glass, metal - into boxes/bags outside fence by entrance gate. Garbage is in black and white plastic bags.
