- 6. The Town of Warwick Spay/Neuter Program for cats has been renewed. \$25 certificates are available at the Warwick Humane for purchase to cat caregivers with proof of Warwick residency with exact cash from 12 noon until 4:00 p.m. daily. The certificate includes the spay/neuter of a cat/kitten and a one-year rabies vaccination.
- 7. The shelter report for the month of December is as follows: 7 dog admissions, 6 strays, 1 owner surrender, 6 dogs returned to owner, 0 dogs euthanized, 8 calls for service by the Warwick Police, 4 stray dogs, 1 injured vulture, 1 injured swan, raccoon removal from CVS and 1 animal welfare check.
  - 8. They do a great job and we need to continue to support them.

Suzyn Barron - President, Warwick Valley Humane Society - to follow up on the Capital Campaign fund that we're having, we don't have a true number yet of what it's going to cost but were hoping it stays under 1.5 million. We won't know that number until our mechanical engineer is finished with the ventilation system and it has to meet the guidelines established in animal sheltering, so he is tweaking it right now. On a very good note his wife Ashley Blake is having a fundraiser for us. She is a local artist and she is displaying work at the Grange restaurant down on Route 94. They will be there for 2 months and anything she sells will come directly to the Capital Campaign Fund. I thought that was very nice. I would like to express and I hope the public will understand this as well, the animal shelter belongs to the Town of Warwick which is all of us who live in this town. It is a community shelter, it doesn't belong to the humane society we just manage it, we take care of it, we operate it, but it doesn't belong to us it's a community shelter. We really need the community to get behind this campaign, so we can reach our goal to bring it into compliance, which it is in compliance as much as it is with the people and for the visitors that come in there. It is also part of this town and it's a beautiful town, we have a beautiful library and there's no reason why we can't be brought up to date and that's what we are hoping to do and we would like the towns people to get behind this. In January I always talk about the importance of dog licenses and rabies vaccines and people need to understand that it's a state law that dogs be licensed in their respected towns and the Town Clerk manages the dog licensing and you need to bring proof of a rabies shot and proof of being spayed or neutered in order to get the discounted rate for licensing. It's just a reminder for dog owners to take responsibility and it's the only true recognition of identification in New York State even though you have microchipping and tags. Only a dog license establishes that you are the true owner of that dog. With all the theft going on today with animals, lost animals, unclaimed animals that is a way to protect your right to own a dog.

For those who don't know the Wawayanders is a community group that has taken it upon themselves the task of keeping and maintaining the Wawayanda Creek open for kayaking and other sporting events out there. We go through and persuade them to let us through once in a while. If anyone is interested in joining the organization please come to the meeting, we can always use extra people especially if you have experience with a chainsaw and are able to go down the creek once a year and help us clean it out, it's always appreciated.

## PRIVILEGE OF THE FLOOR (GENERAL)

Michael Vele – Resident, Lake Shore Road, Greenwood Lake, NY – We've been having issues with water runoff across our property and the DPW was kind enough to come in and put an asphalt buffer in, but we still have an issue. I have a photo here to show some of the runoff across our apron. It doesn't look like there's much there now, but it runs all across and down the property. It puddles, it freezes over, this is our mailbox and it becomes hazardous for my mother to get to the mailbox when it ices up and it's on the apron as well as on the roadway.

Supervisor Sweeton – Was it sheet flowing across the road?

Michael Vele – No, it's coming down an easement in front of our house the water is coming down off of and there are some properties further up the road that are undeveloped and the surface dirt washes off of that. It comes down the easement and lands in that spot. Whenever DPW comes and tries to clear it out the next rain it clogs all back up and it tends to be an issue. That is the concern and also in terms of snow removal and plowing it's a tight spot and we tend to get a lot of snow on our apron when to town or county is clearing the road.

Supervisor Sweeton – Is it the plow trucks from the state when they come on 210?

Michael Vele -6 Lake Shore Road the State of New Jersey will actually make a u turn there, it's a spot where everyone turns.

Supervisor Sweeton – Why don't you give us a contact number for you.

Michael Vele - I will give you my cell number.

Supervisor Sweeton – We will have someone take a look and see what the possibilities are and they'll talk to you. Does that sound good?

Michael Vele - Yes, thank you.




