SUPERVISORS REPORT

- 1. Tomorrow evening at 7:00pm, the Albert Wisner Library is hosting the 2nd portion of the Opioid discussion in town and there will be a panel discussion made up of some health care professionals, police, law enforcement professionals and I believe there will also be some successfully recovering folks that have been addicted to opioids. So, it should be a good discussion. It's Albert Wisner Library at 7pm. They are asking that you register so you can go on their website and do just that.
- 2. We will be holding a Public Hearing for solicitation of projects for this next round of HUD Funding. That is the money that comes through the Development Block Grant and Orange County. It's obviously from the Federal government. It's generally to benefit projects that benefit lower income, handicap or it can be a municipal project but you have to qualify based on income levels so generally we have been supportive of organizations like the Warwick Community Center or Winslow and so we will be holding that hearing and solicit ideas that may be out there.
- 3. I just want to make the public aware that this is surfacing that the governors executive budget has provisions to amend general municipal law to exempt what are termed as micro cell facilities. They are essentially 24X15X12 inch boxes that get mounted on utility poles and the government proposal is these are exempt from local zoning, that it is a permit process only and that municipalities cannot regulate them. So, we are getting more information. I am going to get it out but time is of the essence so the state will try to put a budget in place by April. We are going to reach out to our representatives to say that we are firmly supportive of maintaining local community home rules. Especially zoning control and that we oppose this.
- 4. Repair Café is going to be March 17th 10-2 at the Senior Center. Bring your broken appliances and any kind of thing that is not working around the house that you can transport here. They will help you put them together and just pay for the parts. It's a great service.
- 5. I'd like to point out that this Sunday is the Hudson Valley Saint Patrick's Day Parade. I'd like to Congratulate Councilman DeAngelo. He is the Marshal's Aid to one of the

Parade officials and that is pretty cool. It is in Goshen and kicks off at 2:00pm. It's going to be a nice day.
