The regular meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Warwick was held on Thursday, March 9, 2023 at the Town Hall, 132 Kings Highway, Town of Warwick. Supervisor Sweeton called the meeting to order at 7:30 p.m.

ACCEPTANCE OF MINUTES

1. Regular Meeting- February 23, 2023

Motion Councilman DeAngelo, seconded Councilman Gerstner to accept the minutes as written from the Regular Meeting held on February 23, 2023. Motion Carried (5 ayes, 0 nays)

PRESENTATION:

Police Chief John Rader – I want to thank the Supervisor and Town Board for giving me the opportunity to speak publicly tonight about the police department and some of the highlights of 2022 and the start of 2023. Each month a report is read from the Board on the quantity of calls in our five patrol posts. I would like to give you a breakdown of all the calls for 2022. We handled 17,029 calls for service, 853 criminal cases investigated, 151 arrest, 699 motor vehicle accidents, unfortunately including 4 fatalities which we haven't had a fatality in the Town of Warwick since 2019, there were 3,589 traffic stops and 1,761 tickets issued.

On the community engagement side for 2022 we instituted a body cam program, we brought back Coffee with a Cop after a short break due to covid, the bicycle unit returned with 18 officers volunteering for it, our first ever Junior Police Academy started with two 2 week sessions hosting 20 students in each one, we co-sponsored National Night Out in Veteran's Memorial Park hosting over 1,000 community members to have a night of fun and interaction with the law enforcement, our Color Guard participated in several parades in Warwick and won first place in the Orange County St. Patrick's Day Parade and Orange County Volunteer Firemen's Association Parade, we received gold status with our policy manual which recognizes that our officers not only are in compliance with the policies they take the daily training that goes along with them, we welcomed Applefest back after the covid downtime with most of our department working that day to ensure the safety of the event.

In 2023 we have begun planning for the various community events that start with the beginning of spring. Registration opens tomorrow for this summer's sessions of the Junior Police Academy. We started the planning early for National Night Out hoping to make it

bigger and better than last year. All of this couldn't happen without the dedication and commitment to the community that each employee of the department has. To say that I am proud of them for accomplishing all of this and still doing their jobs every day is an understatement.

With all of that said today was like the Supervisor said a monumental day for the department and for the community. This morning Supervisor Sweeton and I went to Albany for the quarterly meeting of the New York State Law Enforcement Accreditation Council where we were approved and awarded our Certificate of Accreditation. We applied for accreditation in October of 2021 and were assessed this past January. Over that 14 month period the department put forth a huge effort to achieve excellence in 110 standards established by the state. This included updates to our program room, improvements to the inside and outside of the station, equipment upgrades and working with other area agencies who are already accredited.

Our department has worked under approved accredited policies since 2002. In 2021 we changed our policy manual over to a third-party company to administer and update the policies in real time through their large legal staff.

On January 17th a team of 3 officials from the state arrived at our station and over the next 3 days they reviewed our compliance to the 110 standards by verifying that we adopted the standard, that we have policies that follow the standard completely, that we have documentation to support our compliance, they verified our compliance through 167 interviews with 14 police officers and 2 civilian employees, conducted 56 independent observations of our operation, they toured the station, reviewed files and observed different work areas. The standards ranged in categories from our mission statement, arrest procedures, community engagement to disaster preparedness.

The team conducted an exit interview in which we received some of the highest marks they have given in over 24 years of conducting assessments. This could not have been achieved without the support of Supervisor Sweeton, the Town Board and Chief McGovern who started the process.

The real credit goes to each member of our agency who conducts themselves in a professional manner every day and exemplify the standards that we have to meet and also credit goes to their families that support them.

We will be re-assessed every five years and I have no doubt that the members of our department will continue to receive high marks in their work.

Less than 30% of the police departments in New York State have achieved this status. This is a proud day for our department and the community that we serve. Our marked cars will display the accreditation sticker and each employee will wear the accreditation pin on their uniforms signifying our commitment to excellence.

I am going to ask the Sergeants to pass out the pins to the officers who are present with us here tonight and once again, I want to thank the Town Board, the Town Supervisor, the members of our department and their families for helping us achieve this tremendous award.

Supervisor Sweeton – I just want to say in my 21 years here I've been proud of a lot of things in the Town of Warwick this is one of the best. It says to the community that we have an incredibly professional department that works hard day in and day out to provide the best service to them to keep them safe, keep their community safe and in the days that

we live in today where police are under assault in a lot of ways you should be very proud of what you and the department have done here today. It sets you in a place I think that should give our residents great comfort in knowing the caliber of service they are getting from all of you. I want to thank you all and the Board shares in that and you should be very proud and we are very proud of you, thank you very much. For the publics information too, I did sit in on the exit interview and the three reviewers who were here for multiple days running you guys through all of this, their comments were normally at the end of the process they have suggestions and its not things that change their decision but how to make the department better and the lead evaluator said in all of his time in doing this he never remembered once where he didn't have a suggestion to make, but in our case he had none. Again, kudos to you and the department for that.
