ENVIRONMENTAL CONSULTANTS REPORT

COUNCILMAN DE ANGELO REPORT

- 1. The Post Report for February 2018 is as follows: Greenwood Lake had 189 calls, the Town outside the Village had 753 calls, Pine Island had 255 calls and the Village of Warwick had 504 calls for a total of 1,701 for the month of February.
- 2. I have a note from Suzyn Barron, the President of the Warwick Valley Humane Society saying, they won a second prize of \$1,000 from Shelter Animals Count which is a national data base which provides opportunity to view data from similar organizations. They are having a rabies clinic on April 22nd at the Warwick Valley Humane Society from 10:00 a.m. until 12:00 noon. Once year vaccinations at \$15 cash per pet and all dogs must be restrained on leashes and cats in carriers. On May 5th they are having a Community Showcase in the Village of Warwick from 10:00 a.m. until 4:00 p.m. On May 7th they are having their For the Animals Golf Outing at Mansion Ridge Golf Course. On May 12th their Drive a Ford fundraiser at Leo Kaytes Ford, it's free and Ford will donate \$20 per participant. Their goal is to register 300 people to Drive a Ford to benefit their homeless pets. The shelter count is 15 dogs, 91 cats and 1 infant kitten, 7 rabbits and 1 rooster. They are always asking for contributions; equine pine pellets for litter for the cats, Friskies pate or any ground cat food and large dog bones.

COUNCILMAN KOWAL REPORT

1. In February I was contacted by a local citizen about the ship that we have at the

Pine Island with a couple of improvements they had suggested and we took note of that. Back in February when it was 50 degrees the DPW came out and fixed it pretty quick. We also got a heads up that there was a problem with the tennis courts and I went out last week to see. That kind of repair requires warmer temperatures for the materials needed to make the repair work. DPW has been made aware of it and we put a couple of cones around so nobody trips on it. It's an indentation in the court and we will fix that as soon as the temperature and manpower allow because they have been busy working with snow remove the last couple of weeks.

COUNCILMAN GERSTNER REPORT

- 1. The Vice Chairman Mike Cipolla from the Town of Warwick Recreation Commission and our Village and Town Representatives for recreation. We had a meeting last week, everyone came out, it was a good meeting and we exchanged a lot of notes back and forth. They are all working together. Karen Thomas couldn't make it that night due to the weather but I will fill her in. We utilized all the resources and it was a good meeting and we are all going to get back together again. Mike is going to set up a meeting again with our youth sports presidents to go over all of our fields and introduce everyone again because of new representatives in there and the lacrosse has combined again. It worked before but it will work a little easier with one organization.
- 2. I would like to thank all of the members in the villages that ran and congratulate all the winners in the village elections.

COUNCILMAN SHUBACK REPORT

1. As of Friday, the Town of Warwick and the Village of Greenwood Lake because we maintain the roads there also, the expense for snow removal was over \$120,000. I spoke to Mr. Feagles this morning and he didn't have the figures for the fuel just the employees.

Supervisor Sweeton – It has been a tough winter with these storms.

Councilman Shuback – I know two weeks ago I couldn't get into the village. Also, in Wallkill we have an inspection on April 9th. The representatives of the Muck Land are in the Town of Goshen, Minisink, Warwick and Wawayanda and 39% of the land is in the Town of Warwick so that's why our share is 39% of the budget. In the last 5 years they went to private contractors to cut the trees down and they are doing a better job because they only get so much.

Supervisor Sweeton – We save a lot of money.

Councilman Shuback – They don't have to worry about overtime because two owners do it themselves.

Supervisor Sweeton – I want to thank you for going to that inspection for me on that date. I appreciate that.

Supervisor Sweeton – This is funded through a grant from the New York State DEC. The Shade Tree Commission saw it and successfully got it, the cost of this will be borne by the grant and is hoped to be done in May.

SUPERVISORS REPORT

- 1. The Community Preservation Fund receipts for February were \$84,261.50 and today we closed on an additional farm the Newport Bloom Farm, which is the former Luft Farm. We had New York State Department of Ag and Markets paid 75% of the cost and the Open Space Institute paid 15% of the cost so the acquisition of that farms development rights cost the Town of Warwick \$11,900.00. It's a pretty good bargain and it is being farmed and is now owned by Will Brown and Barbara Felton who run the Lowland Farm so they are combining it with their farm.
- 2. Clean Energy Communities is a program through NYSERDA in New York State to allow you to access some grant funds to promote renewable energy and there is a set of criteria that you have to meet to be eligible for the grants. We are working with Bill Makofske a local Warwick Resident and NYSERDA. We have all of the pieces to qualify for the grant we just need to put them together. One of the things tonight we are going to do tonight is adopt a revised uniform solar permit which we already use and there are some other things I'm working on so hopefully by our next meeting I will be able to report that we met the criteria for the grant.
- 3. Streetlight Purchase update, we've been working with the three villages on purchasing our streetlights from O&R and converting to LED's with the potential in saving in electric energy will cover the cost to purchase over a period of time. The pay back at this point looks to be somewhere in the neighborhood of 5 years which is ok not bad. We're currently seeking vendors that we could get proposals from to come in and do the conversions and long-term maintenance. We are still exploring that, I know the Village

moving forward with one company and the Village of Warwick, the Town and the Village of Greenwood Lake are still at the point of seeking vendors.

4. The Governor and his executive budget introduced a new clause in the State Law that would take local control of siting of small cell facilities, essentially, they are 24x15x12 boxes that get mounted on utility poles or traffic lights. It uses a different wave length but because it operates over a shorter distance you need many of these. The state is trying to preempt our ability to control those through our zoning and also any charge that we can place on the location of these. The State Assembly and the State Senate have both taken it out of their budget proposals, but as we all know in Albany those negotiations go down to the wire and there's give and take. NYCOM and the Association of Towns on the State level and the Orange County Association of Towns has opposed this effort and continue to work to try and make sure it doesn't take away our local control.

Councilman DeAngelo – Are the towns going to issue a proclamation?

Supervisor Sweeton – We did and we forwarded it to our Assemblyman and our Senator who say they're opposed and also to the Governor and the majority leader of both the House and Senate.

- 5. The journal entries have been made and double checked by myself and the Comptroller and that's all in order.
