Supervisor Sweeton – I want to thank Lieutenant Rader for doing a lot of the leg work on finding different ones, evaluating them, talking to other agencies and finding which is the best fit for us and we do appreciate that. I think it will be a great addition for the department and for the community.

SUPERVISORS REPORT

- 1. Operation Clean Sweep is held annually and I think Warwick and the Town of Monroe are the only two that do it anymore. This is focused on roadside cleanup of all the debris you see that ends up on the side of the road. We are not sure how if it flies out of trucks, or careless citizens, but it's there and we need to clean it up. the Chamber of Commerce sponsors this and it's normally on a weekend 23rd and 24th but they are extending it a week to the prior weekend of the 16th so if you have that free and you want to collect and help clean up some of it and clean up your road where you live that would be great. They will supply bags and gloves and if it's a heavily traveled road they will give you safety vests. You leave the bags at an intersection or collection point and then our highway department on the 25th and 26th will pick those up and the Country graciously waives the tipping fees for us to take them. I know the villages participate in a lot of this as well and we are glad. On the 23rd on South Street in the Village of Warwick the Lions will be collecting paper shredding, eyeglass and hearing aids and rubber cleats, there will be a pill drop by the Warwick Police Department and the Warwick Coalition. We will have the information on the website for you, but if you can participate that would be great. Leo Kaytes is accepting oil at their showroom and the Computer Guy on Overlook Drive and Galloway Road is accepting computers, electronics, not TV's or cellphones at his location all of that week the 16th-23rd.
- 2. Arbor Day Foundation, we received a letter from the Arbor Day Foundation congratulating the Town of Warwick on again, being a Tree City. It is relatively new to us and we've only been doing it for about 5 years which has been rejuvenated by Karen Emmerich and her Board of the Shade Tree Commission and we are grateful for them and we are proud that we received that again.
- 3. For public service information you see a lot of ads or you might be solicited by people to accept free soil it seems like it's a good deal, but a lot of times the soil is contaminated. In the Town of Warwick, it's illegal for you to do that without suppling the Town Building Department with an analysis of the soil before you accept it. The problem for the homeowner is unfortunately it falls on them if it turns out to be bad soil and has to be removed. Usually, they can't find the person who delivered it after that. We just ask you if you have a question and you need it that's fine, just make sure you come into the Building Department and it's done right.
- 4. Climate Leadership Community Protection Act, I don't know how much of this is on anybody's radar, but this was legislation passed by the State of New York in 2020. It's a very aggressive piece of legislation to get us to move towards sustainable energy and it was adopted in 2020 and then Covid hit and nothing got done with it until recently. Now the schedule is even more aggressive because you lost two years and people need to be aware. The draft is at climate.ny.gov and they are currently accepting public comments on the draft plan. It's 800 pages it's a chore probably to read but, there's some very aggressive goals and you need to see them and understand them and if you have comments make them.
- 5. The Warwick Prevention Coalition is hosting a discussion of Cannabis, Alcohol and our youth. It's a very relevant topic since the State of New York approved recreation marijuana. This is going to be held at the Warwick Valley Community Center and it's

going to be on March 30th from 6:00 p.m. until 8:00 p.m. at 11 Hamilton Avenue in the Village of Warwick, so if it's a concern or you have questions there will be a panel and I suggest that you try to attend that.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Town of Warwick shall publicize this resolution and through this publicity shall cause owners of real estate, developers, and builders to become aware of their respective responsibilities and rights under the Federal Fair Housing Law, the New York State Human Rights Law, and any local laws or ordinances.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the municipality will at a minimum include, but not be limited to: (1) the printing and publicizing of this resolution, a fair housing public notice and other applicable fair housing information through local media, community contacts and placement on the Municipal website and in other social media; (2) distribution of posters, flyers, and any other means which will bring to the attention of those affected, the knowledge of their respective responsibilities and rights concerning equal opportunity in housing.

Discussion: Supervisor Sweeton stated that this is a parcel that would connect our park at Cascade to the Orange County Park. We have a federal grant that would allow us to create a hiking trail connection from Cascade to the County Park, but it entails as it currently exists a 3 mile walk down Cascade Road to a parcel the town owns and then a complicated crossing of the Long House Creek and a switchback trail up the side of the ridge to the County Park. The cost of that, because it's a federal project by the time it got approval designed from the New York State Department of Transportation which oversees these, only allowed \$350,000 left for the construction. We've bid it twice and the bids have come back at close to \$900,000 which we just cannot support spending on a trail. The acquisition of this parcel in conjunction with Open Space Institute will allow a very simple ridge line trail to the County Park and very close to Cascade Park and at a cost that should allow us to do it for the remaining funds in the federal grant. That's why this makes sense and that's why we want to pursue it and we thank Open Space Institute for working with us on this project.

Hon. Mayor Daniel Harter – I wanted to thank everyone on the Board here for your help and support with the Village of Florida's acquisition of property as the Supervisor said it's going to be asset for the community. It has so much potential going forward and I

just want to thank you again for your support.

Supervisor Sweeton – You're very welcome and we are happy to partner with the Village of Florida on this effort because it's good for the environment.

Trisha Miller – Resident, Warwick, NY – Several weeks ago there was a protest on school grounds against the mask policy that wasn't mandated by the School or the School Board. My initial concerns were addressed to the Superintendent, but what I've found out since then once the Police Department comes the responsibility is turned over to the Police Department. I'm just wondering what the policy is regarding the protest that distracted the students and potentially could have become dangerous. Why they weren't escorted off of the school grounds or what would happen if a protest were to take place again?

Supervisor Sweeton – We're going to work with Doctor Leach, we were actually in touch with him that whole time and we had twice the number of Officers in the vicinity then we would normally have for that. We do an after-event analysis and we are committed to work with the schools on however they want to police that and we will do it in a manner that everyone stays safe. Yes, that will be out and Doctor Leach, I think, responded today to somebody I haven't responded to the one email yet that once that policy is established it would be disseminated.

Trisha Miller - Thank you.

Supervisor Sweeton - You're very welcome.
