COUNCILMAN DE ANGELO REPORT

1. The Post Report for March 2022 is as follows: Greenwood Lake had 129 calls, the Town outside the Village had 512 calls, Pine Island had 263 calls, the Village of Warwick had 478 calls and the Greenwood Lake Volunteer Ambulance District had 49 calls for a total of 1,431 for the month of March.
2. Suzyn Barron, President of the Warwick Valley Humane Society relayed a story to me regarding a baby fox that was found in the middle of the road on Annabelle Lane last week. The Animal Control Officer responded and transported it to the vet and arranged for him to be transferred to a New York State Licensed Wildlife Rehabilitation Facility.
3. A note to the public please call the shelter before intervening unless it's an emergency situation and always wear gloves if handling an animal.
4. There are 12 dogs, 50 cats, 2 rabbits and 2 horses are available for adoption and applications are available at wvhumane.org or by calling 845-976-2473.
5. They are having their first annual Walk 'N Wags dog walkathon fundraiser on Sunday, May 1st from 1:00 p.m. until 4:00 p.m. at the Pine Island Park at 37 Kay Road in Pine Island. There is a \$25 pre-registration fee per adult online or \$30 for same day registration at 12:00 p.m. The fun day includes prizes to be awarded for the top three pledge raisers, face painting, dog contests, kids activities, food and music. Dogs are not required to participate and dogs and kids are admitted free. All the proceeds will benefit our shelter pets.
6. The Town of Warwick Friendly Visitor Program for the month of March the number of neighbors helped was 31, the number of volunteers helping those neighbors was 30, the total number of services provided by volunteers was 373 and the number of volunteer hours provided were 212. There are 181 neighbors in the program and 72 volunteers. They need more volunteers. COUNCILMAN KOWAL REPORT

1. With our spring weather that we're having this week agricultural activities throughout the town, especially the black dirt has been picking up quite a bit, so I'm asking the residents to please be mindful and careful when they are stuck behind a piece of wide equipment or other agricultural apparatus. They are traveling as fast as they can safely travel on the road. I'm not farming anymore but I was moving a piece of my own equipment on Pulaski Highway for a short distance and I was just amazed this afternoon to the carelessness of the drivers that are on the road. It doesn't matter if we are going slow, you can't pass somebody around a corner on a double yellow line when you can't see in front of you. A car almost had a head on collision with another car and there's no reason for it. They are out there growing the food for you that everybody enjoys, give them a break, there's equipment and they are doing the best they can to keep out of your way. They don't want to be on the road they want to be in the field. They are trying to get to the fields, so a little patience, a little forbearance and just take it easy out there. It was nerve racking just the short distance today on the road, it was bad.

Supervisor Sweeton – We are lucky we still live in a relatively strong farm economy town.

Councilman Kowal – Some of the people that move through don't share that opinion.

Supervisor Sweeton – Let's see if we can't spread the word.

COUNCILMAN GERSTNER REPORT

1. I want to thank Commissioner Astorino for the report. The DPW finished the kayak launch down at Wickham. They are out using hot patch now for the potholes, their daily work of culvert pipes and drainage and doing tree work.

Section 1. The Town is hereby authorized to purchase a Komatsu Loader for the Department of Public Works. The estimated maximum cost of said class of objects or purposes, including preliminary costs, legal documents and costs incidental hereto and the financing thereof, is \$180,000.00 and the said amount is hereby appropriated therefor. The plan of financing is the issuance of \$180,000.00 serial bonds to finance said appropriation and the levy of a tax on all the taxable real property within the Town to pay the principal of said bonds and interest thereon as the same shall become due and payable.

Section 2. Serial bonds in the principal amount of \$180,000.00 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the Local Finance Law, constituting Chapter 33-a of the Consolidated Laws of the State of New York (herein called "Law"), to finance said appropriation.

Section 3. The following additional matters are hereby determined and stated:

a) The period of probable usefulness applicable to the purpose for which said serial bonds herein authorized are to be issued, within the limitations of Section 11.00a.28 of the Law, is fifteen (15) years.

b) The proposed maturity of the bonds authorized by this resolution will not exceed five (5) years.

c) The proceeds of the bonds herein authorized and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of said bonds may be applied to reimburse the Town for expenditures made after the effective date of this resolution for the purpose for which said bonds are authorized. The foregoing statement of intent with respect to reimbursement is made in conformity with Treasury Regulation Section 1.150-2 of the United States Treasury Department.

Section 4. The bonds authorized by this resolution and any bond anticipation notes in anticipation of the sale of said bonds, shall contain the recital of validity prescribed by Sec. 52.00 of the Law and said bonds and any notes issued in anticipation of such bonds, shall be general obligations of the Town, payable as to both principal and interest by a general tax upon all the taxable real property within the Town without limitation of rate or amount. The faith and credit of the Town are hereby irrevocably pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and interest of said bonds and any notes issued in anticipation of said bonds, and provisions shall be made annually in the budget of the Town by appropriation for (a) the amortization and redemption of the bonds and notes to mature in each year and (b) the payment of interest to be due and payable in each year.

Section 5. Subject to the provisions of this resolution and of the Law and pursuant to the provisions of Sec. 21.00 relative to the authorization of the issuance of bonds with

substantially level or declining annual debt service, and of Sec.30.00 relative to the authorization of the issuance of bond anticipation notes and of Sec. 50.00 and Sec. 56.00 to 60.00 and 168.00 of the Law, the powers and duties of the Town Board relative to authorizing bond anticipation notes and prescribing the terms, form and contents as to the sale and issuance of the bonds herein authorized and of any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of said bonds, and the renewals of said bond anticipation notes, and relative to providing for substantially level or declining annual debt service, are hereby delegated to the Town Supervisor, the chief fiscal officer of the Town.

Section 6. The validity of the bonds authorized by this resolution and of any notes issued in anticipation of said bonds, may be contested only if:

- (a) such obligations are authorized for an object or purpose of which the Town is not authorized to expend money, or
- (b) the provisions of the law which should be complied with at the date of the publication of such resolution are not substantially complied with, and an action, suit or proceeding contesting such validity is commenced within twenty days after the date of such publication or
- (c) such obligations are authorized in violation of the provisions of the constitution.

Section 7. This resolution shall take effect immediately.

Section 8. The object or purpose described in Section 1 hereof has been determined to be a Type II Action pursuant to the regulations of the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation promulgated pursuant to the State Environmental Quality Review Act.


things that could happen there in the coming years. We are all excited about that and I think it's really great.
