COUNCILMAN DE ANGELO REPORT

1. The week of May 9th to May 15th is National Police Week, so if you get a chance thank a Policeman for all they do for us.
2. The Post Report for April 2021 is as follows: Greenwood Lake had 99 calls, the Town outside the Village had 460 calls, Pine Island had 213 calls, the Village of Warwick had 359 calls and the Greenwood Lake Volunteer Ambulance District had 37 calls for a total of 1,168 for the month of April.

Police Lieutenant Rader – We normally do awards during Police Week, we didn't last year due to Covid, so I expect sometime in the future we will recognize all the good work from the past two years.

3. The Warwick Valley Humane Society is in need of an Animal Care and Dog Control Officer which includes weekends, holidays and designated on call nights. You must be 21 years old, live within 15-20 minutes of the Warwick Shelter and have animal experience. 85% of the duties is animal care including feeding, cleaning, feeding, medicating, training and handling of dogs, cats, rabbits etc. of all sizes and temperaments. Wage is based on experience, there's a 3-month probation period and if you call the Warwick Humane Society for an appointment at 845- 986-2473. They are in desperate need of an additional officer.

4. They asked me to remind the public that baby birds should be returned to the nest unless injured.

5. Fawns are left all day out in the open with mom's unseen but nearby, please don't touch them. Please call the Warwick Valley Humane before intervening to determine if intervention is needed.

6. For adoption they have 12 dogs, 36 adult cats, 8 kittens, 9 rabbits and 1 guinea pig.

COUNCILMAN KOWAL REPORT

1. Planting in the black dirt area has wound up. There are a few crops waiting for warmer weather because we still have the threat of frost. I would ask our residents when you're going through any part of town, agriculture is still predominant industry in the town. Please have patience behind a piece of equipment. They are large pieces of equipment now a days and if it's not safe to pass please don't. today I was behind a liquid manure tank for about a mile and even though I wanted to get passed him there wasn't any segments of lines making it safe. You have to be a little patient and remember they are growing food that we all are blessed with in this country. When you get behind somebody don't make it worse by causing an accident.

Supervisor Sweeton – It is part of the charm of living in the Warwick Valley.

COUNCILMAN GERSTNER REPORT

1. I am still working with our Recreation Commission Chairman Mike Cipolla to set this meeting up with our organized sports leagues and our village and town summer rec programs. We aren't sure what we are doing with them yet, but we want to have a meeting with them. I saw our Town of Warwick Chairwoman Paulette Wilk Rudy today and expressed to her my apology for the delay, but we are still trying to get this together. We still aren't sure if it will be both live and zoom but Mike is working on getting dates out for me.

Supervisor Sweeton – We do have a meeting tomorrow Councilman Gerstner, with the people from Altice to try and finalize the renewal of their franchise agreement.

Supervisor Sweeton – The bid is on the bike pedestrian trail that is a federal grant and it's been years, Sue Kelly got it originally. It had struggles, it seemed to be back on track, we went out to bid originally and received 8 bids that were totally out of control. We rebid it after splitting it up and the bids are still out of the ballpark. We're vetting that and we're in touch with the DOT to let them know there's no way we are building this trail for this amount of money. We will see where that goes, its unfortunate. The other one I want to just point out, I think it was our sign person Anthony Mann who found the lower bid for the machine and we actually budgeted for the higher, so thank Anthony for doing that research and saving the town a little bit of money.

SUPERVISORS REPORT

1. **St. Anthony's Community Hospital is having a Walk-In Vaccination Clinic** tomorrow from 8:30 a.m. until 4:00 p.m. and they are going to try and continue that. We just want to spread the word and encourage people to get vaccinated. This morning or this afternoon the CDC released guidelines that if you have been fully vaccinated you don't need to wear a mask in public whether you're indoors or not and respect businesses that may require you to wear one. In New York the Governor hasn't conceded to that yet, but we expect hopefully in a few days he will, so that's good news and that means vaccinations work. So, please get to St. Anthony's if you haven't. if you know of someone who is a homebound senior that hasn't been able to get out to a vaccination center, you need to call the county at 615-3700 and they will arrange to have professionals come to the home and a vaccine to a homebound senior.

2. Orange County Household Hazardous Waste Day is going to be June 5th and this is the first time they are doing this again. It is in Port Jervis which is only 35 minutes away from here. You can go on a Saturday, which is free to Orange County Residents and it's located at 10 Route 209 in Port Jervis at the High School lower parking lot. You can get rid of all the old chemicals sitting around.
3. We are having a modified Too Good to Toss event this year. That was the event the last few years where you brought it to Stanley Deming and you can come and take it. It has to be in good working order. Because of the pandemic they don't want to do that, so they are doing a modified version. There are going to be 40 locations in the village and 60 in the town. You have to sign up and they are going to get you a sign and, on that weekend, you will be able to put a list of material and I quote "Too Good to Toss" out. We can't take money for them but you can come by and take stuff. If you want more information, it's on our Facebook page and it will be in the paper as well. That is going to be on June 12th and 13th.
4. The Memorial Day Parade is going to be held on May 31st here in Warwick and we are excited about that to honor those who have fallen and service our nation. It will be done safely and we are very glad that we can have that memorial again this year. That will be on the 31st of May, a little late this year.
5. Hello Warwick Valley is a new tourism effort to promote all of the Town of Warwick including its villages and hamlets. You just go on Hello Warwick Valley by going on your phone, on a pad, your computer and it's a pretty cool site. A lot of good work went into it, they have a great logo so let's spread the word and continue to encourage people to come visit our town.
6. Community Preservation Fund for April was a robust \$181,278.35 which brings the total in the fund to \$4,637,227.79. It's just an indication that people are continuing to sell houses and move into Warwick and its helpful for us in acquiring development rights on many good farms.
7. Journal entries have been made with our new Comptroller, Bonnie who has settled in and working really hard. She's doing great. Ana has come back part time for a little bit and has limited that because she said Bonnie has settled right in and is picking it up really well.
8. Supervisors Corner is published each week in the Warwick Dispatch, with excerpts printed in the Warwick Advertiser.

#R2021-150 RESOLUTION TO EXTEND COMMUNITY PRESERVATION FUND

Motion Supervisor Sweeton, seconded Councilman Gerstner to adopt the following resolution:

Whereas the NYS Legislature in 2006 passed the authorization for the Town of Warwick to put the question of imposing a $\frac{3}{4}$ of 1% real estate transfer tax on land transfers with the Town of Warwick to a vote of its residents and;

Whereas the proceeds were to be used to preserve the community character as defined in the Community Preservation Plan, especially its Agricultural economy and;

Whereas since its inception in 2007 the Warwick Community Preservation Fund (CPF) has, in partnering with among others the NYS Department of Agriculture and Markets Farmland Preservation Program, preserved over 4,300 acres of active farmland and;

Whereas many of these farms supply fresh food to over 10 million people in the NYC metropolitan area and the lower Hudson Valley and;

Whereas this legislation is set to expire in 2026 and there are many farms still seeking funding from this program and;

Whereas it can take several years to complete a development rights acquisition and prime farmland in the Hudson Valley continues to vanish at an alarming rate due to development pressure as a result of COVID 19. It is also fiscally imprudent for the Town to commit to acquiring the development rights of farms without extending the CPF beyond 2026 year and;

Whereas the Town has submitted a home rule request to extend the CPF with bills A05324 and S2689 which have been introduced in the 2021 NYS Legislature;

Now therefore be it resolved that the Town Board, on behalf of the residents, urges both the NYS Senate and NYS Assembly to move these bills to the floor of the legislature for a vote and also urge Governor Cuomo to sign the bills extending the Warwick CPF in order for our community to do our part to achieve the State's goal of preserving farm land that provides healthy, safe food for the NYS residents.

#R2021-162 BOND RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN OF WARWICK, ADOPTED MAY 13, 2021, AUTHORIZING THE RECONSTRUCTION OF WISNER HALL STATING THAT THE ESTIMATED MAXIMUM COST THERE OF IS \$1,244,000.00, APPROPRIATING SAID AMOUNT THEREFORE, AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$999,000.00 SERIAL BONDS TO FINANCE SAID APPROPRIATION

Motion Supervisor Sweeton, seconded Councilman Gerstner to adopt the following resolution:

WHEREAS, all conditions precedent to the financing of the capital project hereinafter described, including compliance with the provisions of the State Environmental Quality Review Act, have been performed; and

WHEREAS, it is now desired to authorize the financing of such capital project; NOW THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE TOWN BOARD OF THE TOWN OF WARWICK IN THE COUNTY OF ORANGE, NEW YORK, (by the favorable vote of not less than two-thirds of all the members of said Board) AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Town is hereby authorized to reconstruct Wisner Hall as a business accelerator building. The estimated maximum cost of said class of objects or purposes, including preliminary costs, legal documents and costs incidental hereto and the financing thereof, is \$1,244,000.00 and the said amount is hereby appropriated therefor. The plan of financing is the payment of \$245,000.00 from current funds and the issuance of \$999,000.00 serial bonds to finance said appropriation and the levy of a tax on all the taxable real property within the Town to pay the principal of said bonds and interest thereon as the same shall become due and payable.

Section 2. Serial bonds in the principal amount of \$999,000.00 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the Local Finance Law, constituting Chapter 33-a of the Consolidated Laws of the State of New York (herein called "Law"), to finance said appropriation.

Section 3. The following additional matters are hereby determined and stated:

a) The period of probable usefulness applicable to the purpose for which said serial bonds herein authorized are to be issued, within the limitations of Section 11.00a.12 of the Law, is fifteen (15) years.

b) The proposed maturity of the bonds authorized by this resolution will not exceed five (5) years.

c) The proceeds of the bonds herein authorized and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of said bonds may be applied to reimburse the Town for expenditures made after the effective date of this resolution for the purpose for which said bonds are authorized. The foregoing statement of intent with respect to reimbursement is made in conformity with Treasury Regulation Section 1.150-2 of the United States Treasury Department.

Section 4. The bonds authorized by this resolution and any bond anticipation notes in anticipation of the sale of said bonds, shall contain the recital of validity prescribed by Sec. 52.00 of the Law and said bonds and any notes issued in anticipation of such bonds, shall be general obligations of the Town, payable as to both principal and interest by a general tax upon all the taxable real property within the Town without limitation of rate or amount. The faith and credit of the Town are hereby irrevocably pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and interest of said bonds and any notes issued in anticipation of said bonds, and provisions shall be made annually in the budget of the Town by appropriation for (a) the amortization and redemption of the bonds and notes to mature in each year and (b) the payment of interest to be due and payable in each year.

Section 5. Subject to the provisions of this resolution and of the Law and pursuant to the provisions of Sec. 21.00 relative to the authorization of the issuance of bonds with substantially level or declining annual debt service, and of Sec.30.00 relative to the authorization of the issuance of bond anticipation notes and of Sec. 50.00 and Sec. 56.00 to 60.00 and 168.00 of the Law, the powers and duties of the Town Board relative to authorizing bond anticipation notes and prescribing the terms, form and contents as to the sale and issuance of the bonds herein authorized and of any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of said bonds, and the renewals of said bond anticipation notes, and relative to providing for substantially level or declining annual debt service, are hereby delegated to the Town Supervisor, the chief fiscal officer of the Town.

Section 6. The validity of the bonds authorized by this resolution and of any notes issued in anticipation of said bonds, may be contested only if:

- (a) such obligations are authorized for an object or purpose of which the Town is not authorized to expend money, or
- (b) the provisions of the law which should be complied with at the date of the publication of such resolution are not substantially complied with, and an action, suit or proceeding contesting such validity is commenced within twenty days after the date of such publication or
- (c) such obligations are authorized in violation of the provisions of the constitution.

Section 7. This resolution shall take effect immediately.

Section 8. The object or purpose described in Section 1 hereof has been determined to be an Unlisted Action pursuant to the regulations of the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation promulgated pursuant to the State Environmental Quality Review Act and a negative declaration has been adopted.

The Town Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to publish the foregoing bond resolution, in summary, in WARWICK VALLEY DISPATCH, a newspaper published in Warwick, New York, the official newspaper of said Town and having a general circulation therein, together with Notice attached in substantially the form as prescribed by Sec. 81.00 of the Local Finance Law of the State of New York.

This resolution shall take effect immediately.


