SUPERVISORS REPORT

1. Coronavirus Update

a. Town operations, we reopened the building on Tuesday as we entered phase 3, as I mentioned in previous meetings the Town Hall services have been available throughout the pandemic. I want to thank the dedicated employees who made that happen. We were able to handle residents' inquiries by the phone, emails and the lobby, but now we are back to having the building open. There are a lot of precautions in place, the only portion of the Town Hall that is not fully operational is the Court. That is not under our control, that's run by the Court Administration. They have just recently allowed dog cases, civil cases and small claims before the local Justice Court. The Court Office is staffed Monday through Friday, once again it is closed from 12-1 for lunch for the Court Clerks, but other than that it's open. Vehicle and traffic is yet to be determined on

when that will be available if you are pleading not guilty, if you are pleading guilty you can send in your fine for that.

- b. Our playgrounds across town are open and they are being sanitized daily and signs are posted to encourage children that are using it to practice social distancing to keep them safe.
- c. Our Town Beach is open and is open this year only to Town of Warwick residents and that includes Village Residents. You can purchase season passes at the Town Clerks office at 986-1124. We are limited to 50% capacity on the beach and so far, that has been going very well and the season passes maybe because its town residents only are really up this year. We want town residents to become familiar with it, enjoy it and we hope that it will get well used this summer.
- d. Tentatively in the Hudson Valley we should enter into Phase 4 on July 7th, however, there is now some updated changes to that from Governor Cuomo's office. He's pulled gyms and theaters out of Phase 4 while they evaluate whatever data they want to evaluate, so we don't have any directions for gyms at this point and that is a big concern since there are several in the Town of Warwick. In Phase 3 you can now have restaurants indoors at 50% with all the social distancing guidelines. Nail salons are open, tattoo parlors, if you are so inclined, they are open again, with all of the guidelines that still need to be met. We are still doing very well in the Hudson Valley in terms of low numbers of positive cases and we need to continue to do that and again we urge residents to please follow the guidelines, use your masks when you're close to other people six feet or less, wash your hands, do all the necessary precautions and especially our senior population because they are the most at risk population in this pandemic and it behooves us to do what we can to keep them safe, so we ask for your cooperation in that regard. I want to point out tonight and kudos to Mayor Newhard, he has worked hard with the New York State Department of Transportation and the State Liquor Authority to be able to close down Main Street from TD Bank to West Street, as well as Railroad Avenue and Spring Street for restaurants to expand out into the roadway for dining. That's going to happen for the next 4 weeks on Thursday, Friday and Saturday from 4:00 p.m. until 10:00 p.m. and on Sunday's a little bit earlier in the day. So, we will see how that works out hopefully people will abide by the regulations and it will be a good shot in the arm for our local merchants.
- 2. The Community Preservation Fund Extension of the Expiration, we submitted a home rule request both to the Assembly and the Senate to extend the Community Preservation Fund, which has preserved over 4,200 acres here in the Town of Warwick which is 37 working farms, which it includes Winstanley Park and our Beach, Thomas P. Morahan Park. We asked if that be extended from an expiration date of 2026 to 2050. I will say that Senator Metzger did move it in the Senate and it was passed in the Senate and it is being held up by the Majority Office of the Assembly and their only explanation was that we have plenty of time and why are we rushing. The point is it takes a while to prepare for a referendum which is required to extend it. The voters get to decide to extend it, not the Town Board but they don't have that right to exercise that until the State Legislature allows that bill into the Assembly. I reached out to our Assemblyman Karl Brabenec, I reached out to Assemblywoman Aileen Gunther in a bipartisan manor to get this on the assembly floor and at this moment the Majority Councils office in the New York State Legislature Assembly refuses to bring it to a vote. We are disappointed in that and the session has not ended yet, but I would behoove any resident in the Town of Warwick

that finds that the Community Preservation Fund has been beneficial to the Town of Warwick and its residents to contact the New York State Assembly Councils Office, the Majority Office and ask them to move the bill to the floor for a vote.

- 3. I want to offer my Congratulations to the Warwick Valley High School and SS Seward Class of 2020. They have gone through a very difficult period in their senior year, it was a lot of disappointment for them, but there will be celebrations of what they achieved and how they have weathered the storm, so we congratulate them on behalf of the entire Town Board. The receipts in the Community Preservation Fund for May were \$62,677.04, again it was above average receipts for May and we are grateful for that and it helps us continue our program.
- 4. The journal entries were made with our Comptroller and they were all in order and I thank her for her diligent work on that.
- 5. Supervisors Corner is published each week in the Warwick Dispatch, with excerpts printed in the Warwick Advertiser.

We are going to waive this permit because we do work with O&R, they do a lot of in-kind service for us and tree removal etc., so we will waive that tonight if all are in favor.
