Supervisor Sweeton asked the Town Board and the public to pause for a moment of silence for the passing of Wayne Stevens a long time Town of Warwick Employee, a community member who served for many years with distinction with the Warwick Fire Department as a past Commissioner, Chief and President of the Raymond Hose Co. who passed away on June 15, 2018.

PRESENTATION:

Karen Emmerich - Chairperson of the Town of Warwick Shade Tree Commission - Thank you for giving us some time tonight. I have here tonight Sophia Rodbell who is from Davey Resource Group and she is part of the team of 4 people that are inventorying the trees in the town at all of our parks and 12 cul-de-sacs throughout the town. They started on Monday and we are hoping to be done tomorrow. I would like Sophia as part of the grant that we received for this project we need public participations; public information and she will give a little presentation to you tonight helps with that. Also, as we go forward and prepare the management plan working with Davey we will require public input as well. I will let Sophia describe what she's doing with her procedure and staff.

Sophia Rodbell – Davey Resource Group – We are working on your inventory of an estimated 2,500 trees for the town and it's coming out to be closer to 1,100 sites for the entire town for what we are looking at. What we do is I have a team of 4 with myself, Will, Herb and Carolyn who is the upper project manager. We go around to all of your public trees and check their health, how they're growing, maintenance, what needs to be done as a village or town to take care of them to mitigate risks to the public, to property or public spaces and this will include checking the crowns for defects. We use tree risk assessment qualification which is an ISA program that looks at a target that we pick in the tree and the likelihood of it to fail and where its going to hit and it's the consequences from that damage that helps our clients, the town go through and take care of the most important necessary priority pruning first and then move out to what needs to be cleaned up.

Supervisor Sweeton - Have you found any insect issues and things like that?

Sophia Rodbell - Yes, we've found strong evidence of EAB but I recommend you bring in an entomologist.

Supervisor Sweeton - Ok, and that will be all part of the report where you show that.

Sophia Rodbell - Yes.

Supervisor Sweeton – We appreciate it. For the publics information this was a grant that the Shade Tree Commission obtained from the New York State DEC. Thank you, Karen, and everybody on the committee for that. I know you did a lot of the work and it's great.

Sophia Rodbell - On a side note we do have a program that we use that's available to the public to see where we have placed all the trees. I will be giving everybody a link to that and you will be able to go and see if there's a tree in front of your house and how it's doing.

Supervisor Sweeton - Great and thank you for being here. We appreciate it.

Sophia Rodbell - Have a nice day.

Karen Emmerich - Thank you.

Supervisor Sweeton – Thank you Karen I appreciate that and all the work of the Shade Tree Commission. You planted a lot of nice trees this year at the beach which was great and thank you for that.

ENVIRONMENTAL CONSULTANTS REPORT

COUNCILMAN DE ANGELO REPORT

1. The Warwick Valley Humane Society currently has 22 dogs, 84 cats, 40 kittens, 8 rabbits, 3 guinea pigs and 1 rooster stray from Brady Road. Their upcoming events their will be a rabies clinic on Sunday, July 15th from 10:00 a.m. to 12 noon. One-year vaccinations by Dr. Pam Shultz of Orchard Grove Animal Hospital. It is \$15 cash per pet and all dogs must be restrained on leashed and cats must be in carriers. All proceeds benefit the homeless pets. There is an acupuncture clinic on Sunday, August 19th by appointment only. They have a wish list of pate ground cat and kitten canned food, heavy duty garbage bags, pine pellet litter, large and medium dog biscuits, dish detergent and monetary donations for the Critical Care Fund. Suzyn Barron asked us to remind the public that all dogs over the age of 4 months must be licensed in the Town of Warwick, including all villages and hamlets, with the Town Clerk and the Warwick Town Hall at 132 Kings Highway. Proof of rabies vaccination must be presented, it's \$10 for spay/neutered dogs and \$20 for un-spayed/unneutered dogs.

COUNCILMAN KOWAL REPORT

1.We had some weather setbacks in March and that put some scheduled maintenance in the parks a little bit behind schedule but they are starting to catch up rapidly. The park in Winstanley Field the bathrooms are being roughed in and hopefully in a few more weeks that will be up and running. G. Leaving boats unattended or stored at Wickham Woodlands Park or the Wickham Lake Boat launch at Simpson Lane is prohibited. Owners of such boats violating the provisions of this chapter are subject to the immediate removal of such boats, without notice, by the Town, the cost of storage of such boat(s) by the Town, and the penalties provided in Section 106-11.

The Town of Warwick Town Code is hereby further amended by adding Section 106-11 C. to read as follows:

Section 106-11 C. Storage Fees. Commencing on the effective date of this Article, the boat storage fees shall be \$15.00 per day.

Section 2. – This Local Law will take effect upon the filing of same with the New York State Secretary of State.
