Like going to the store or being taken to a doctor's appointment or even a chore at the house and it's all done by volunteers and we fund the maintenance of the relationship with the Jewish Family Services. There is no cost to a Senior so if you know of a Senior that could use the service please have them call here at Town Hall 986-1124 ext. 400 you can leave a message and Jean our coordinator will be in touch with you to see if we can match a Senior with a volunteer. The volunteers are all vetted, trained and insured so you can be comfortable having them provide this service.

Vincent Copello – Our partnership is not only with the Jewish Family Services it's also with the Office for the Aging in Orange County.

Supervisor Sweeton – Thank you very much we appreciate it, so please spread the word because we want the program to grow. The idea is to keep Seniors in their homes as long as we can because it's a much better quality of life.

Deputy DPW Commissioner Astorino – We are doing our chip sealing program and there are signs up on the roads that are completed. Residents please drive slowly until the chip seal completely sets. We sweep the extra off and we should be done within the week.

Unfortunately, in the fiscal times that we live in here and not burden taxpayers tremendously we do use it and in fact it's a much better way to treat country roads which are not really built on bases that would lend themselves well to paving. The technology has gotten much better so the chip is smaller, it sets faster and it's not as onerous as it use to be, so beware and when the crews are there please make sure you pay attention to the flag people who are traffic directing to make sure the workers are safe as they do this work for us.

COUNCILMAN DE ANGELO REPORT

1. The Post Report for June 2019 is as follows: Greenwood Lake had 161 calls, the Town outside the Village had 666 calls, Pine Island had 267 calls, the Village of Warwick had 533 calls and the Greenwood Lake Fire District had 52 calls for a total of 1,679 for the month of June.

2. The current guests at the Warwick Valley Humane Society are 15 dogs, 81 Adult

cats, 50 kittens from 3 weeks to 5 months old, 8 rabbits and 2 guinea pigs and all 156 animals are available for adoption. The current wish list is pate style canned cat/kitten food, Science Diet dry dog and cat food, paper towels, large heavy-duty garbage bags, romaine lettuce, carrots, care fresh small pet bedding and cat cage toys. There were 178 spay/neuter return certificates that were sold to date. These are \$25 certificates to spay/neuter a cat by a Town Resident which includes a rabies vaccination. The Humane Society is encouraging everyone who is feeding outdoor cats to take full responsibility for the animals and buy one of the spay/neuter certificates for the Animal Rights Alliance Spay/Neuter clinics. The Town of Warwick is subsidizing this important program to alleviate the nuisance and overpopulation of cats in our community and to prevent the needless suffering of countless kittens.

COUNCILMAN KOWAL REPORT

1. The new equipment at the Pine Island Park is a big hit, every time I go by, I see kids playing on it. The onion has been fabricated and is being shipped as we speak and that will be installed as soon as the Pine Island Rec. Program concludes so we don't interfere with them.

2. Please be advised due to the hot dry weather the Wawayanda Creek is not as great of a kayaking experience that it was back in June. The water level has dropped a few feet and there are additional obstructions and it would be a much more challenging trip then it was a few weeks ago. Hopefully we get some more rainfall this summer or fall time and bring it back up to an easier level to travel. The DPW put some signs on the lake to remind people to be aware of the changing conditions in the creek.

Supervisor Sweeton – I just want to point out because they had an inquiry. The Town runs the Recreation Program in Pine Island called the Pine Island Rec. Program and it's a six-week program and it's in session right now. When it is in session from 9:00 a.m. until 3:00 p.m. the Pine Island Park is closed and that is a safety issue for the number of children that are there and to make us be in compliance with State Regulations on day programs. So, the other parks are open and available but just be aware there are signs posted and nobody should be surprised and the new playground is obviously an attraction and the people want to go check it out. You would just have to go after 3:00 p.m. during that six-week period which started July 1st and goes through the middle of August. Just be aware of that and pass the word.

Supervisor Sweeton – For the publics information this is the original Manor House at the old prison and It's town owned. The intent there is to stabilize the structure so we don't loose it. It's a structure dating to the 1800's and once we do that then we can work to renovate the interior and perhaps turn it into a community space or a job training venue for working with the IDA that will complement the Tech Park, so we want to move forward with that if we can.

SUPERVISORS REPORT

1. The Community Preservation Fund receipts for the month of June were \$86,638.09. That will help us continue our efforts to preserve farms. We are working on closing on the development rights on two additional farms in Warwick, so that's a good thing.

2. I want to mention that there's an old fashion 4-H Fair and Family Festival hosted by Cornell Cooperative Extension. This will be in the town of Mount Hope and they have built a beautiful 4-H facility. They will be having old fashion farm events and exhibits for you to enjoy. The event is July 26 from 3:00 p.m. until 10:00 p.m., the 27th from 9:00 a.m. until 10:00 p.m. and the 28th from 9:00 a.m. until 3:00 p.m. located at 300 Finchville

Turnpike in Otisville, NY but is located in the Town of Mt. Hope. If you would like more information you can contact Cornell Cooperative Extension at 344-1234.

3. A reminder for anyone interested in Orange County and its transportation there will be another public session and this one will be held at the Mulberry House Senior Center at 62 West Main Street in the City of Middletown. They have another one in Newburgh and they are going to plan another one in the City of Port Jervis. The County is obligated to take a look over the next 20 years to see where its needs are in terms of moving people around the County and providing transportation. If you are interested in that please check it out.

4. I received a note from our Deputy Town Historian, Sue Gardner that reminded me that in July of this was the 15th anniversary of our Preservation of our Farmland Program. this was an effort that was spearheaded by Seymour Gordon who has since left us and it was championed through the process by the Town Board at the time, Jimmy I think you served on the Board at that time. They gave the Town Residents an opportunity to vote on a bond referendum and that passed and then we moved onto the Community Preservation fund which was a successor. To let you know from that 15 year ago effort we've preserved to date 4,168 acres of active farms in the Town of Warwick and I think that bodes very well for the quality of life here and the future of the generations that will make this their homes. Congratulations to anybody who was involved in that over the years.

5. The journal entries were made with the Comptroller and I want to report that they are all in order to the Board.

WHEREAS, Father Robert J. Sweeney retired on July 1, 2019 after twenty-five years as pastor of Holy Rosary Catholic Church in Greenwood Lake, New York; and

WHEREAS, Father Sweeney has been the longest serving pastor in the history of Holy Rosary Church; and

WHEREAS, prior to answering his call to the priesthood, Father Sweeney worked in radio and television for WOR Radio and ABC/DEF and served in the United States Army. Father Sweeney was ordained to the priesthood in 1982; and

WHEREAS, during his tenure at Holy Rosary Catholic Church Father Sweeney, affectionately known as Father Bob, has had the privilege of baptizing and blessing the marriages of several generations of the Holy Rosary Parish Community; and

WHEREAS, Father Bob has served as a spiritual leader for several community organizations, served as a parish priest at Trinity Church in Poughkeepsie, New York, later assigned to St. Joseph's in Bronxville and St. John's in Goshen before being appointed pastor to Holy Rosary Catholic Church by Terence Cardinal Cook; and

WHEREAS, Father Bob was a past Chaplain of the National American Legion, and for the past twenty-five years has been serving as the American Legion ANAVC Detachment Chaplin. Father Bob was the Chaplain for the Mid-Hudson Forensic Psychiatric Center Institute; and

WHEREAS, Father Bob currently serves as Chaplain for the FDNY Retired Firemen of Orange County and the Hudson Valley and is a member of Minisink, Trout Brook and Goshen Fire Departments;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that on behalf of a grateful community, the Town Board of the Town of Warwick does hereby declare July 28th Father Bob Day in the Town of Warwick.

PRIVILEGE OF THE FLOOR (GENERAL)

Luis Abramson – Resident, Town of Warwick, NY 10990 – A couple of weeks ago I spoke with the Ellenville Police Chief because my son is autistic. I have been traveling with him for the past two almost three years to Ellenville from Warwick. I've been bringing a lot of awareness and a lot of well needed help and one of the things that I've done is the Orange Regional Hospital you can call and the child is prechecked and put into a room and all of the machines can be taken to the child now instead of taking him from one room into the next, which only adds to the anxiety. When I was speaking to the Police Chief there, they have an autistic center, which is a private one for pre-school and they have their first responders go to a training out of state. They do active shooting four times a year which is mandated, but they also do in April they do a rotation of all of the Officers to come in and be with the children. This is a way for the children to not be afraid of the Police Officers and it gives the Police Officers a way to get to know the children. He offered without hesitation to come down to Warwick and provide training, training that his department has already paid for and already have, but they are a very unique situation because they actually respond and train actively in the autistic program for 35 children. I think it would be an asset to the community in Warwick to be able to obtain that training. The training is being offered at no charge and he said it very clearly you destinate the location and he will come with his team. I met the Sergeant and he has a nephew who's autistic so it's very personal. I know the fire department has a sign now right below the yield that says disabled child area. Narrowsburg has taken an initiative amongst themselves to go to houses that parents would accept it letting them put a sign there letting them know there is a child there with special needs. I live in a cul-de-sac, kind of on a dead-end road but there is speeding going on in my road and unfortunately my dog was hit by a vehicle in front of my house. I know now that my son is five and even though we've taken precautions and closed in the back there is still the tendency for the child to run off. That is one of the issues we have been dealing with at the center that he goes to and it's one of the top centers in the region and it's quite expensive at \$75,000 to send him. It is The Center for Discovery and they do not take children over the age of 5. This is a big issue in our County and it's not going away and I think if some of the first responders could utilize some of this training which is always good. My prior background in NYPD I had numerous trainings I went to transit, to corrections all through NYPD to district ADA and pistol licensing. I received all

kinds of training and training that's vital for first responders to do their jobs effectively and every little bit will help.

Supervisor Sweeton – I got your message and I was only able to talk to the Chief yesterday and he would look in favorable upon it, so what I will do is schedule with you to sit down and see what kind of logistics we might need to do.

Luis Abramson – That's all that ask and thank you.

Supervisor Sweeton – I will be in touch with you either tomorrow or Monday and we can start to talk about the details.

Luis Abramson – Thank you so much.

Supervisor Sweeton – Thank you for coming.

Councilman Gerstner – Watch the heat this weekend.


Supervisor Sweeton – Once again if you know of someone who is a neighbor that maybe elderly just look in on them if you can when this heat condition exists. We have a 24-hour police 986-5000, so you can call them to check on a resident. We can open up the Senior Center and we can open up this building if people need some cooling. I know a lot of people go to the libraries because it's much more entertaining then this building but its available.

Councilman Gerstner – The beach will be open.

Supervisor Sweeton – The beach is open. There has been reports of an algae issue and that is in the very southern end of the lake near West Milford. It is not shown to be anywhere in the northern end of the lake the New York side at this point.
