Supervisor Sweeton – The reason we are not doing that ourselves in house is because all of the water lines at the former prison which is where this district is are extremely deep, 12 feet or more underground. We don't want to put our employees in that environment

because we don't have the shoring material that would be required for safety. We will go into a contract on that and it's a water district charge. I want to make note that Councilman DeAngelo is absent today because he serves on the ZBA in the Village of Greenwood Lake and he's chairing a very important meeting there today.

SUPERVISORS REPORT

1. The receipts for the Community Preservation fund in July were \$114,798.06 and the total in that fund to date \$3,139,933.90 and we are still in the process with two farms that we are attempting to close. One is Newport Bloom II, which is formally known as Warwick Views. It was a large proposed subdivision of 50 homes and Will Brown is putting that into PDR. We are going to try and take advantage of the new state program preemptive to purchase rights which actually pays the farmer or owner slightly more than what the development rights are and it restricts it further so the farmer can only sell it to someone who's going to farm, so a young farmer. It's an idea to try and keep more young kids in farming and give them an opportunity and Will Brown is attempting to do that. We'll see how that goes working with the state on it.

2. O&R Smart Meter installation that's going on now in the Town of Warwick. They will contact you and you can opt out and they will give you a surcharge if you don't use the smart meters. The smart meters in theory allow them to be monitoring your electric use and you can also see your electric use. It also alerts them faster to outages and where they are and in theory through technology provide better service. Get educated about it, they will get in touch with you and you can go to oru.com/smartmeters if you want to know more about it.

Councilman Kowal – We had ours put in two weeks ago and it took 10 minutes.

Town Clerk – Where our agenda is listed on the Town Board website it has supporting documents and it lists all the streets they will be visiting and they will notify you also.

Supervisor Sweeton – That's townofwarwick.org, it's been newly revamped and we're very pleased with that.

3. As Councilman Shuback mentioned the Senior Barbeque is Tuesday, August 27, 2019 so come out if you're a Senior you get a free ticket from my office and come out, it's a great day and it will be a lot of fun.

Supervisor Sweeton – hopefully tonight the Board will approve the purchase of one similar to what the Village of Warwick has and right now that one is on South Street Ext. it is solar powered

and it also has recording information so you can look back and see data on speed. Initially our desire is to put it on Little York Road where it has a little bit heavier traffic from a business out there especially as you get into the fall. It's a narrow road and we had to reduce the speed limit there and its just to remind people to slow down that you're on a country road. It has the ability to move around and DPW can do that. We do have a speed trailer that the police do put out and the Chief was able to get that repaired and we will have that in addition that can be located other places. There are several roads Bellvale Lakes Road we know we have some issues on and again it's solar powered so that's always a good thing. I know the village is very happy with it.
