COUNCILMAN DE ANGELO REPORT

1. The Post Report for August 2019 is as follows: Greenwood Lake had 183 calls, the Town outside the Village had 668 calls, Pine Island had 298 calls, the Village of Warwick had 495 calls and the Greenwood Lake Fire District had 50 calls for a total of 1,694 for the month of August.

Police Chief McGovern – I want to mention the correspondence from Chief Young from Vernon Police Department was kind enough to forward to us. It probably will affect commuters that they are going to be grinding and resurfacing Warwick Turnpike at the New Jersey State line all the way to the West Milford Town line. Most people don't realize when you cross over into New Jersey you're still in Vernon not West Milford, so that short couple of miles of road is going to be redone. It is listed here in the report and I asked the

Clerk if she could add to the scrolling TV screen because I'm sure it's going to affect some of the commuting traffic.

Town Clerk – It has been added to the TV and it's on our website too.

Chief McGovern – Ok great. Thank you.

Supervisor Sweeton – I was caught in it so it does take an extra 10 or 15 minutes.

2. The report for the month of August for the Warwick Humane Society is as follows with the current resident count 13 dogs, 85 adult cats, 58 kittens, 9 rabbits, 2 guinea pigs and 3 mice with a total of 170 resident animals. They have an upcoming fundraiser their 8th Annual 5K4 Paws road race on Sunday, September 15th at Glenmere Lake in Florida. The registration begins at 8:00 a.m. and the race starts at 9:00 a.m. It is \$25 per runner or walker and there will be music and refreshments to follow, pre-registration is not required and for more information you can call 986-2473 and its rain or shine. They need the following items bleach, paper towels, Pate style cat/kitten food, heavy duty garbage bags, equine pine pellets to use as litter, rabbit toys and food, spray bottles, kitten milk replacer, non-automatic shut off heating pads and they need people to adopt some of these residents. They want to thank the Town for supporting spay/neuter program. they are also trying to raise additional money for their shelter.

SUPERVISORS REPORT

1. The Budget Process for 2020 is underway with the first preliminary stages of it and it's always a challenging year to try and live within the cap and still meet the needs of our residents. We are going to do the best we can and that process will wind up when we do a

public presentation of the budget in early November. I appreciate all of the departments getting their budgets requests into me on time and we will begin the work to try and fit that into what's an appropriate budget for 2020.

2. The Community Preservation Fund receipts for August 2019 were \$92,329.67 and the total amount in the fund is \$3,232,263.57. There are two farms currently in the process that we are working on with the State of New York and the Federal Government to get them to a closing and to accept their contributions to the program.

3. Warwick's Homecoming is this Saturday and will get into Main Street around noon and quickly vacate by 1:00 p.m. and head back out to school. We wish the kids well and look forward to seeing the floats on Saturday on Main Street.

4. The Senior BBQ was a great success, it was one of the best I think this year. We had a lot of volunteer help, we had a lot of great donations, we covered all of the cost of putting it on for the seniors. I would say we had 500 seniors attend, it was a beautiful day and they really appreciate it. I want to thank everyone, especially Mikes Custom BBQ who does all of the cooking and the chicken and preparing the meal. It was really great and a lot of thank you to go around. Also Dagele Farms for supporting all the corn that Councilman Shuback gets for us, we thank them for that. WVT gave desserts, donations from the two supermarkets in town, generous financial donations from service clubs, Jeff Rosenberg and his family.

5. I want to congratulate Dr. Richard Hull our Town Historian. He recently received the Franklin D. Roosevelt Local Government Historian Professional Achievement Award at a ceremony in Albany on September 10th. It was awarded in recognition of his outstanding career and achievement in the practice of public historian in the State of New York. Congratulations to Dr. Hull and we wish him great success with that.

6. Journal entries I made with the Comptroller, checked them and we both concur and they have been done in order.

7. We are wrapping up our 2018 independent audit and we should have that auditors report within the next week or so and we'll present it to you and the Board once we receive it. Everything went very well with that, so we are pleased.

Motion Councilman Gerstner, seconded Councilman DeAngelo to adopt a resolution to authorize the Supervisor to sign an agreement with the Village of Florida for the control of snow and ice on Glenmere Road for the sum of \$4,000.00.

Motion carried (5 Ayes, 0 Nays) Supervisor Sweeton declared this resolution duly adopted.

Discussion: Supervisor Sweeton stated that this is done every year and it's a stretch of Warwick Road between Chester and the Village of Florida and it makes so much sense for them to do it.

**#R2019-241 TOWN OF WARWICK TOWN BOARD FINDINGS PURSUANT TO THE
"MONROE BALANCING OF PUBLIC INTEREST TEST" 315
GLENMERE AVENUE**

Motion Supervisor Sweeton, seconded Councilman DeAngelo to adopt the following resolution:

WHEREAS, the Village of Florida ("Village") is a municipal corporation duly organized under the laws of the State of New York, with all powers granted thereunder; and

WHEREAS, the Town of Warwick ("Town") is a municipal corporation duly organized under the laws of the State of New York, with all powers granted thereunder; and

WHEREAS, the Village owns property in the Town located at 315 Glenmere Avenue (the "Premises"), in the Conservation (CO) zoning district and identified on the tax map as Section 9, Block 1, Lot 6.1; and

WHEREAS, the Premises is currently used as the Village's water treatment plant;

WHEREAS, the water treatment plant needs to be upgraded to comply with State and Federal water quality regulations;

WHEREAS, GHD Consulting Services, Inc and Fusco Engineering have prepared a Water Treatment Plant Process Evaluation dated August 2019 setting forth the recommended repairs and upgrades;

WHEREAS, the Village of Florida Village Board declared its intent to be lead agency pursuant to the State Environmental Quality Review Act ("SEQR") on August 7, 2019 and has distributed notice of such declaration to all interest or involved agencies;

WHEREAS, the Court of Appeals in *In the Matter of the County of Monroe*, 72 NY2d 338 (1988) established a "balancing of the public interest" test in determining whether a municipality was subject to another municipality's zoning law; and

WHEREAS, although the Court of Appeals did not identify which municipal entity should conduct the balancing test, the Town hereby determines that as the host community responsible for the enforcement of its zoning law, it has the authority and the right to conduct the *Monroe* balancing test and enforce its findings; and

WHEREAS, the Town hereby weighs the nine (9) factors set forth in *Monroe*: 1) the nature and scope of the instrumentality seeking immunity; 2) the encroaching government's legislative grant of authority; 3) the kind of function or land use involved; 4) the effect local land use regulation would have upon the enterprise concerned; 5) alternative locations for

the facility in less restrictive zoning areas; 6. the impact upon legitimate local interests; 7) alternative methods of providing the proposed improvement; 8) the extent of the public interest to be served by the improvements; and 9) intergovernmental participation in the project development process and an opportunity to be heard.

1. The nature and scope of the instrumentality seeking immunity. The Village is the “instrumentality” seeking immunity from the Town zoning law.

2. The encroaching government’s legislative grant of authority. The Village is a municipality within and adjoining the Town duly organized under the laws of the State of New York, with all of the power and authority vested in it by the State Legislature and by the New York State Constitution. Such grant of power, however, does not extend to regulation of land contained within the Town, which is solely vested in the Town Board.

3. The kind of function or land use involved. The Village seeks immunity from the Town zoning law so that it may upgrade its water treatment plant to provide potable water to Village residents and other users including the Valley View Center, Hearthstone and Orange County Correctional Facility.

4. The effect local land use regulation would have upon the enterprise concerned. The use of a building, structure, lot or land or part thereof which is not listed as a permitted use, special permit use or accessory use is prohibited. Town of Warwick Zoning Code. In this case, Town of Warwick uses and buildings are permitted but not uses and buildings belonging to other municipalities.

5. Alternative locations for the facility in less restrictive zoning areas. There is no “alternative” location in the Village, as this is an existing structure. Relocating the water treatment plant would be cost prohibitive and impractical.

6. The impact upon legitimate local interests. The Town recognizes that water treatment, is a crucial function that should not be constrained by zoning issues. By granting immunity to the Village, the Town significantly reduces planning and zoning costs which will be borne by residents of both the Town and the Village as Village residents are also Town residents.

7. Alternative methods of providing the proposed improvement. There are no other alternatives.

8. The extent of the public interest to be served by the improvements. As noted, water treatment is an essential government function which benefits the Town, the Village and the County.

9. Intergovernmental participation in the project development process and an opportunity to be heard. The Town will have all rights afforded under law to participate in the State Environmental Quality Review process as well as the intergovernmental planning

process provided for by General Municipal Law § 239 et seq. This waiver of zoning will be considered at a regular meeting of the Town Board upon to the public.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT REOLVED, the foregoing “WHEREAS” clauses are incorporated into and made an integral part of this Determination and Resolution;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Premises have been used as a water treatment plant and the Town wishes to ensure that such use continues; and that the Town Board finds that the effect of granting immunity from its zoning law to allow the prohibited use to continue would be minimal as set forth in the Monroe balancing test herein;

IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board of Trustees finds that there shall be no impacts on legitimate local interests of any kind and will have no real or practical effect on the community, the environment or other factors.

IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED that the Town Board hereby finds that the Monroe balancing test conducted herein favors the continued use of the Premises as a water treatment plant and for the necessary upgrades Therefore, the Town waives its zoning law for that purpose and that purpose only and determines that the Village of Florida may continue to use the Premises located at 315 Glenmere Avenue identified on the Town of Warwick tax map as Section 9-Block 1- Lot 6.1, for water treatment together with the necessary upgrades.

IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED that the Town Board hereby consents to the Village Board serving as Lead Agency for purposes of SEQR.


