COUNCILMAN DE ANGELO REPORT

- 1. The Post Report for September 2019 is as follows: Greenwood Lake had 186 calls, the Town outside the Village had 727 calls, Pine Island had 270 calls, the Village of Warwick had 426 calls and the Greenwood Lake Fire District had 42 calls for a total of 1,651 for the month of September.
- 2. The Warwick Humane Society's current residents is as follows with 17 dogs, 93 adult cats, 49 kittens, 10 rabbits, 1 guinea pig, 1 rooster, 7 hens, 3 mice and 1 rat. They have an upcoming fundraiser with Comedian Bobby Collins who will be performing at the Sugar Loaf Performing Arts Center on Saturday, October 19th. The doors open at 6:00 p.m., the show is at 8:00 p.m. and the tickets are available at Ticketmaster or OMEEVents.com. all proceeds to benefit the Warwick Valley Humane Society's Rebuild the Shelter Fund. There is a full-time job opening at the Warwick humane Society. They are looking for an Animal Care and Control Officer. You must be 21 years of age, with a clean driver license and background. The position includes designated night emergency calls, and at least one weekend day. Dog-cat experience preferred, must work well with

others, be personable, good attitude, be able to lift 50 pounds and take initiative. You can contact the shelter at 986-2473. This evening I would like Mr. Bruce Wittels from the Humane Society to give us the status report for the shelter rebuild.

Dr. Bruce Wittels - I'm a veterinarian and I'm on the Board for the Warwick Valley Humane Society and I'm also a member of the Building Committee. Today we finalized and had an architectural stamped set of plans for our new building. This is pretty momentous given the time we started, so that's great. In the immediate future we're going to be putting out some bids so we have an actual idea of what the building is going to cost us. We have figured were about 1.5 million at this point and the number can go in either direction. To date we have \$850,000 in our building fund and that included a \$550,000 grant from New York State to help re-build the shelter. We had an anonymous donor of \$100,000 and a local group donated \$125,000. The problem that we are having is, we can not start construction until we have the full amount of money. The reason being is the new building requires a demolition of some of the existing building and that means we have to house some of these 90 somewhat cats that we've got outside of the facility. Once that building comes down, we really want to keep that time down that these animals are offsite to a minimum. We really don't want to start breaking ground until we do have the full amount of funding that we need. We really would like to really start breaking ground in the spring of 2020. Our commitment from the State ends in March of 2121, so if we're not done by that point and time, they withdraw the \$500,000.

Supervisor Sweeton – You've made tremendous progress and is there anyway you can take half of it down?

Dr. Bruce Wittels – No because of the size. The square footage on the ground is 6,500 and there's just no room. There is no way we can leave what's there. Plus, what's there really needs to come down. What's there is not really in the current state of what's needed. We are behind the eight ball as far as what the current standards are.

Supervisor Sweeton – Some of it goes back to the 60's, right?

Dr. Bruce Wittels – Yes and then there have been multiple additions here and there kind of convoluted and not in any particular form or shape. We don't have the proper circulation, we are well, well overcrowded and for movement of the employees one has to backup to allow another to pass. We've got dogs in bathrooms and in the president's office it's loaded top to bottom with cats and kittens. That whole facility any part of it, but we are leaving the dog runs and the dog kennels because they are functional and they are ok. That's part B of the build and we want to improve that facility as well. There really isn't anyway to leave a part of the existing building. It really needs to come down, it leaks and it doesn't flow and there's nothing proper about it. It was done as an addon here and an addon there and 20-30 years ago that was fine, but in today's state of affairs we really need to change it up.

Supervisor Sweeton – I know with the group that's working on it and Suzyn's spirit you guys are going to be successful. Good luck and thanks for the update and please come back to keep us informed. That would be great.

1. This coming Columbus Day at Pine Island Park it's Pumpkinfest. It is one of the greater events we have out there with a good turnout. - 2. Heat Smart Presentation, is a collaborative thing we are doing with a NYSERDA funded group, Energize New York, to promote a geothermal form of heating and cooling. It's like a split air system and we've been going around different groups to try and make them aware of rebates and things that are available to save on energy costs. The next one is going to be on Sunday, October 13th from 12:30 p.m. until 2:00 p.m. at the Greenwood Lake Public Library. You can learn all about getting free energy audits and learn about the heat smart system. The vendor that's been selected was vetted so you can feel comfortable getting estimates and knowing that you're not getting ripped off and they will explain how it works.

- 4. The Community Preservation Fund receipts for the month of September were \$89,081.56 and that brings the total in the fund to \$3,321,345.13.
