COUNCILMAN DE ANGELO REPORT

1. The Warwick Humane Society's current residents is as follows with 14 dogs and includes 3 dogs court ordered seizure, 93 adult cats and includes 11 cats court ordered seizure, 50 kittens under 6 months of age, 10 rabbits, 7 hens, 3 mice, 1 guinea pig, 1 pet rat and a court ordered seizure and 1 rooster and they are all available for adoption. They have an upcoming fundraiser a champagne brunch to celebrate their 65th birthday to be held at the Landmark Inn in Warwick on Sunday, November 3rd at 12 noon. It will be \$65 per person all proceeds to benefit the Warwick Valley Humane Society's Rebuild the Shelter Fund. Reservations are required by calling 845-986-2473 and the checks can be mailed to the Warwick Valley Humane Society, P.O. Box 61, Warwick, NY 10990 and there is limited seating so get your reservations in for a seat. The Warwick Humane Society is the second oldest Humane Society in Orange County and provides animal control services to the Towns of Warwick and Chester and contracts with Warwick, Chester and Tuxedo to intake stray dogs.

Suzyn Barron – President, Warwick Valley Humane Society – With Halloween coming up the Humane Society is concerned about people's pets because we really don't take into consideration that it's a very stressful time for pets. They hear the doorbell ring, the door knocking and easily when you open the door to give out candy and treats your dog or cat can get out of the building. Don't feed them any candies, make sure they are confined and away from the door by putting them in the bathroom or a bedroom to keep them away from the door. Don't leave them in the yard during Halloween because you might have tricksters who might to antagonize them. Keep glowsticks away from dogs because they would be drawn to them even though they are not toxic but can still cause a lot of upset and can get burned from them. Keep Halloween plants such as pumpkins and corn out of their reach. Don't keep lit pumpkins around pets. Keep electric and battery powered Halloween decorations out of reach. Don't dress your pet in a costume unless it's used to it because we think it's cute but the dog is panicking. Try on costumes before the big event so you know they are going to be okay and always keep identifications tags on your pet because should the pet get out at least there's a way to get them back home. If it doesn't have a tag, we can't get it back to you unless you call us and report the dog missing. I do have a correction to make, we just took in 4 kittens from Drew Road so that bumps our kitten number to 54. Of the 93 adult cats with 11 not available because they are part of a neglect case, we have 82 adult cats and approximately 54 kittens are available for adoption. Of those 54 kittens 2 dozen are black cats, so black numbers in shelters whether they are dogs or cats are the least adopted animal. They spend a lot of time there. If you put a black lab and a golden lab next to each other the golden will get adopted before the black lab will. Right now, we have 2 dozen black cats and kittens available for adoption. We have decided to hold a promotion to try and find them homes because all

those myths you heard about them being bad luck but if you google it you will find out they actually bring good luck. In many countries around the world they are considered good luck. Fisherman would take black cats on their boats because they would hope they would come home safely. Single woman, supposedly if they have a black cat, they have many suiters. All of these myths about them being negative is wrong, so they are great cats and our promotion is \$31, we reduced our adoption fee to \$31 for 31 days beginning on October 31st and that is our hope that we can move some of these young black cats and adult cats out of our building. Our current cat population ranges from 2 weeks old to 20 years old, so please think about adoption and this is why we are building our new shelter because we desperately need the room to provide for this many cats. We want to use adoption as our option for getting them out of the shelter environment.

Supervisor Sweeton - Thank you.

Suzyn Barron – Thank you and don't forget our 65th celebration and more money for the shelter.

Supervisor Sweeton - Thank you for the job you do for us and the town as well.

COUNCILMAN KOWAL REPORT

1. This Sunday at 12 noon at the Jolly Onion Inn in Pine Island the Pine Island Chamber of Commerce will be honoring 3 very special people in our community as we do every year, Katie Rudy Tomczak for Citizen of the Year, Susan McCosker for a distinguished Service Award, she is the one who did all the work with the Kosuga Foundation to get all the new equipment at the Pine Island Park and every time I go there the place is packed. Vidar Hageman is our Youth Achievement Award winner this year, if there are still tickets available you can go to the Chamber site and we would be glad to see you, it starts at 12 and ends at 3. It's great to have the Jolly Onion Inn open again. I remember when I was the Chamber President, we had it at the CYO across the street.

COUNCILMAN GERSTNER REPORT

- 1. On behalf of the Orange County Volunteer Fire Association and myself I would like to thank Lieutenant Rader and the police force for a job well done on the parade held on September 28th. I would like to congratulate the Fire Department for their 150th and thank them and the Board for coming out and the Supervisor for helping serve the marchers, they appreciated that. I just wanted to pass it on to the Chief, Lieutenant and all the members, we had 51 departments there and it went well and everyone got home safe and the whole parade was safe.

1. The DPW has been hauling sand and road grit for the winter and repairing water main breaks. They have been keeping busy cleaning ditches and mowing banks by me on Mt. Eve.

TOWN CLERK'S REPORT

SUPERVISORS REPORT

- 1. I want to give the Board and the public and update, we've been working hard on the 2020 Budget. Currently, we do have the budget under the 2% tax cap and that is our plan to be under it. It was a good target and it was not easy to get to and we continue to try to fine tune that prior to publishing the preliminary budget, which will come out next Wednesday and then have a hearing on November 7th. It's a budget I think that is responsible to the taxpayer and makes investments where needed and does remain under the cap, which is important for our residents.
- 2. We finally got approval from the Public Service Commission to purchase our municipal streetlights. We had an agreement with O&R to do that and we needed PSC to approve it and they finally did. The last piece is to get a consent form for Frontier Communications who oddly enough owns some of the poles in the town jointly with O&R so we need their consent to be on their poles. Once we get that and can conclude the deal the conversion will begin sometime near the end of the year and will proceed through the winter baring any major snowstorms. We will have our lighting system converted over to LED's which will save us in electricity costs and owning them we will no longer have to pay rent to O&R for them. It's a payback for about 5 years and then after that we will accrue over the life of the project, which is a 20-year project so close to \$900,000 in savings.
- 3. Orange County Shared Services Panel, for the Boards information the Governor had an issue two years ago to have the Counties and the municipalities within them present a plan for shared services and saving, which the State would then give you money for those savings. We had submitted a plan last year and there's been no sign of money from the State yet, but the plan is in and we have an opportunity to add to the plan this year. We are working with the County and other municipalities to look for ways to do that, so we'll see and I have my doubts that the money will ever come but it's a good exercise nonetheless.
- 4. The Municipal Comp Alliance Rebate, I want to let everybody know if you remember we used to be in the Orange County Workers Compensation Plan. We left that because of the 8-10% increase in costs yearly to that plan and at the time we left that plan we were paying close to \$800,000 a year in workers compensation insurance costs. When we left the plan and stabilized our cases that were existing our insurance premiums dropped through the municipal comp alliance to about \$450,000 and it's been pretty steady in going down through the years. Just recently because that municipal comp alliance plan has really been established on good financial basis, they were able to offer what they term a loyalty rebate to municipalities and we did receive a check for \$8,000 that came back to us. It has been a good plan and I want to compliment our Safety Committee, John Rader you're one of the main drivers of that with Deputy Commissioner Astorino, so the employees should also be thanked for their participation in safety training and embracing the concept of a safe workplace, so congratulations to them as well.
- 5. Woodland Way, was a section of the road around the new Wickham Park that we actually, labeled as a roadway but the roadway is actually the entire roadway around the perimeter of the former prison that goes down to the park. Now we are going to sign it

properly as Woodland Way so that in an event of an emergency 911 addressing will be attached to it so the police can respond appropriately to any issues down there.

- 6. The journal entries were made with the Comptroller and they were all signed off and are in order.

#R2019-288 RESOLUTION FOR TOWN OF WARWICK TO SUPPORT UPGRADING ROUTE 17 IN ORANGE AND SULLIVAN COUNTIES

Motion Supervisor Sweeton, seconded Councilman Gerstner to adopt the following resolution:

WHEREAS, The Mid-Hudson Region is achieving economic and population growth due to its proximity to New York City and other states as well as being home to attractive communities with a high quality of life.

WHEREAS, The Region has an immediate requirement for infrastructure investments to allow economic development to continue and maintain the Region's ability to attract jobs and preserve its quality of life for its citizens.

WHEREAS, In May of 2013, the New York State Department of Transportation (NYSDOT) issued a study (<u>The Route 17 Transportation Corridor Study</u>) that recommended a new General Use Third Lane be developed along the Route 17 Corridor and found that "additional transportation capacity is needed to address existing and projected levels of congestion in the corridor, provide for enhanced mobility, and allow for future economic growth in both Sullivan and Orange Counties."

WHEREAS, while the improvements underway at Interchange 131 near Woodbury Common, and the proposed improvements to accommodate LEGOLAND are welcome and necessary, they will not address the existing and worsening traffic issues along the Corridor.

WHEREAS, investments along the Route 17 Corridor are consistent with smart growth principles and the 2011 report issued by the Open Space Institute (<u>Private Lands</u>, <u>Public benefits</u>) which found that Sullivan County has the greatest percentage of preferred growth area in the Catskills, "which is largely concentrated in the center of the county and coincides with significant, established infrastructure."

WHEREAS, the full conversion of Route 17 to interstate standards (I-86) was previously scheduled to be completed by 2009, but that has not occurred in many of the eastern sections of Route 17. Major upgrades to Route 17 need to be implemented to meet interstate standards

WHEREAS, as part of the 2018-19 New York State Budget, the New York State Department of Transportation has committed to "provide up to \$5 million to advance environmental and design activities related to the construction of a third travel lane along the Route 17 Corridor in Orange and Sullivan Counties."

WHEREAS, the New York State Department of Transportation recently selected a consultant to conduct a Planning and Environmental Linkage Study (PEL) as the next step in the process leading to the implementation of the recommendations from the Corridor

Study, providing locations of priority and conducting environmental assessments and preliminary engineering.

WHEREAS, the current estimate of the cost of implementing the Corridor Study is approximately \$500 million.

WHEREAS, the Mid-Hudson Valley Region needs to continue to grow and attract businesses and jobs, and the 2013 NYSDOT Study has documented the requirements of the Route 17 Corridor.

NOW, THEREFORE, it is hereby RESOLVED, that we, the Town of Warwick:
