COUNCILMAN DE ANGELO REPORT

- 1. The Post Report for February 2023 is as follows: Greenwood Lake had 115 calls, the Town outside the Village had 394 calls, Pine Island had 192 calls, the Village of Warwick had 369 calls and the Greenwood Lake Volunteer Ambulance District had 54 calls for a total of 1,124 for the month of February.
- 2. The Humane Societies yearly membership drive is underway. They count on the support of their membership at this time every year to help care for animals in need. The membership with our organization enables them to continue to fulfill their mission for our communities furry friends. Membership forms are available at wvhumane.org and new members are always welcome.
- 3. For those feeding outside stray and feral cats, the SNR low cost spay neuter certificate program is available to Warwick residents for only \$25. Certificates area available for purchase at the Warwick Humane by appointment only to be used at the Animal Rights Alliance low cost spay neuter clinic. There is a limited supply and Spring has sprung. Please call 845-986-2473 for more information.
- 4. All dogs over the age of 4 months must ne licensed in the Town of Warwick. dog licenses can be purchased at the Town Clerks office with written proof of current rabies vaccination.
- 5. The new shelter facility is completed and they are in need of daily supplies of Simple Green cleaner, heavy duty garbage bags, paper towels, bleach and Pate style canned cat food.
- 6. The current shelter residents are 7 dogs, 49 adult cats, 5 kittens, 4 rabbits, 4 bunnies and 2 guinea pigs.
- 7. They are having a grand re-opening of the Animal Shelter and the 69th Birthday celebration of the Warwick Valley Humane Society on Saturday, May 20th from 1:00 p.m. until 4:00 p.m. with an open invitation to our community.
- 8. I want to remind everyone that we do have the Friendly Visitor Program which is free for neighbors who need help with going to a doctor's appointment or shopping. They are in need of volunteers and they are having two volunteer training sessions in April. One will be on Tuesday, April 11th at 5:30 p.m. and the other will be on Thursday, April 27th at 10:00 a.m. If you know of someone who might need help we have in the Clerks office we have refrigerator magnets that has the number on it and the number is 845-986-1124 ext.

400. If you think you might know someone who might benefit from this you can pick up a magnet for them at the Clerk's office.

COUNCILMAN KOWAL REPORT

- 1. Back in January of this year we received a call from someone who wanted to volunteer to donate some sound equipment for the outdoor stage at Mountain Lake Park. I went up there with the gentleman and we tried to get it to work that day and it was kind of cold, so we waited until it was warmer. I went up there a week before last and was able to get the equipment running. He is a very generous man and we'll appreciate a donation and he would like to remain anonymous and we will respect that. The speakers and amplifiers work well. We could use a mixer, if somebody has a mixer collecting dust in their garage from a retired band person that would be nice. We do appreciate any and all donations that are made to benefit that.
- 2. On April 6th at Mountain Lake Park, you can go up and do some bird watching. There are some nice trails up there that the Boy Scouts worked this winter to refurbish. The bird watching will be April 6th from 9:00 a.m. until 11:00 a.m. and who knows what you might see.
- 3. Planting season is upon us in the Pine Island area please be conscious and cautious of any farm vehicles they are big and slow. The machinery is bigger than it used to be, but it's not any faster, so please be careful and pass with caution. Remember they are out there growing the food that everyone enjoys.

COUNCILMAN GERSTNER REPORT

1. The DPW has been busy doing drainage on Kain Road and DeKay Road, they are doing some tree work on DeKay Road with O&R removing various trees, removing brush on Little York Road, filling potholes with cold mix, replacing road signs town wide as needed, hauling grit to stock pile, replaced a curb box on Jersey Avenue, snow plowing and sanding on February 28th, March 1st, March 12th and 13th. Thanks to the Commissioner I have numbers here up to February before the 28th 400 pounds of mix, 240 pounds of sand, 174 pounds of salt, 354 tons used for \$5,664.00, 169.13 tons of salt for a total of \$13,060.06, overtime was \$9,342.24 for a total of \$28,066.30. February was a little nicer up to the last day. 48 yards of mix, \$6,191.02 for a grand total through February 25th of \$34,257.32. It's been pretty nice so far and we had a couple more days since then and I appreciate it if you could forward that to me. Thank all the troops for me.

SUPERVISORS REPORT

- 1. This Saturday from 9:00 a.m. until 11:00 a.m. we have a job fair going here in this room for lifeguards, so if you know a young person 15 years old or older that's interested in a summer job. We are doing this in conjunction with the Village of Greenwood Lake and we are looking for enough lifeguards to man both the Thomas P. Morahan Waterfront Park Beach and the towns Mountain Lake Park Pools. Starting salary is from \$15 to \$17 an hour depending on their experience and they need to have a lifeguard and swim instructor Red Cross Certification to qualify. It's from 9:00 a.m. until 11:00 a.m. here in this room at Town Hall and we hope that we get a lot of takers. We are trying to spread the word, we would like to get enough and there may be some incentives offered depending on the length of time if they can stay for the entire season. We will discuss that with anyone who shows.
- 2. The Community Preservation Fund for February was a robust \$134,852.80 and that brings the fund to date to \$15,575,289.27 and that's since its inception in 2007. It has been put to good use in preserving farmland and open space including the two parks in the Village of Greenwood Lake.
- 3. Orange & Rockland is doing their tree trimming around the utility lines, so you'll see the trucks out and I think its Nelson Tree Service. They do that so when we have bad weather you don't lose your power and these branches don't come down. Please give them courtesy as they work.
- 4. Tree City Recognition, once again we received the designation as a tree city. We are relatively new into the program last 4 or 5 years thanks to Karen Emmerich from the Shade Tree Commission and Commissioner Bill Roe. Congratulations to them on their work in getting that designation for us.
- 5. Orange County has their first 2023 Hazardous House Hold Waste Collection Day and it is Saturday, April 15th from 9:00 a.m. until 3:00 p.m. at the transfer station fire training center in New Hampton on 17M across from the Psych Center. It is free to Orange County Residents and you can bring all those things oil, stains, polishes, cleaners you have under your sink that you don't use. You can not do electronics that day or household batteries. If you are a business or a farm you can call the County Environmental Services Department and you can make an appointment to go on Friday and there is a fee for a farm or a business, but it's a good way to get rid of that material. It is also listed on our website, thanks to the Town Clerk.
- 6. Code Red Alert is our new alert system that we have and we're encouraging residents to sign up for that. It has existed in the Village of Greenwood Lake for a year or so, but I encourage you to sign up to this one as well to make sure you're getting all of the alerts. You can text Warwick Alert to 99411, you can drop a form off at the Clerks Office

or you can go on our website click the button and enter as a guest and register yourself. You will only get emergency messages from us and not trying to sell you something.

- 7. We did receive a letter from the New York State Department of Transportation. If you remember we had sent correspondence in October of 2021 requesting at the behest of our Police Department that we reduce the speed limit to 45 mph on Route 17A from the Village of Warwick to the Village of Greenwood Lake border. We received a letter that they have evaluated the crash data and they respectfully decline to reduce that speed limit. Their data shows that 85th percentile of speed there was 53 mph and the speed data that they collected at Mt. Peter Road indicated that the 85th percentile speed was 51.2 mph, so they are not going to reduce the speed there.
- 8. The journal entries were made with the Comptroller, they were all checked and they were all in order.
- 9. Supervisors Corner published each week in the Warwick Dispatch, with excerpts printed in the Warwick Advertiser.
