PARKS DEPARTMENT**ENVIRONMENTAL CONSULTANTS REPORT****COUNCILMAN DE ANGELO REPORT**

1. The Post Report for January 2019 is as follows: Greenwood Lake had 184 calls, the Town outside the Village had 664 calls, Pine Island had 245 calls, the Village of Warwick had 518 calls and the Greenwood Lake Fire District had 53 calls for a total of 1,664 for the month of January.

2. The Warwick Valley Humane Society has been awarded a \$500,000 grant from the New York State Animal Companion Fund which will be put toward the rebuilding and expansion of the animal shelter from the lobby to the office. They are halfway to their goal to complete the project. Their current resident list includes 14 dogs, 98 adult cats, 9 kittens, 7 rabbits, 1 guinea pig and 5 roosters and they are all eligible for adoption. February is "Adopt a Homeless Rabbit Month" Adopt a rabbit and take home a new toy for your new bunny. The 5th Annual Polar Plunge will be on Sunday at 3:00 p.m. at the Thomas P. Morahan Waterfront Park to benefit the homeless pets during the Greenwood Lake Winter Carnival. You can pre-register on ACTIVE.com or at wvhumane.org or on Saturday during the carnival and same day registrations begin at 2:00 p.m. It will be \$25 per plunger, there will be a prize to the best costumed plunger and a prize to the plunger

with the highest sponsor donations. They also asked me to thank Ben for helping them with their flooding problem they had.

We wanted to inform the landowners if they would allow us access to their property to do maintenance on the trees, which would make it much easier then us floating down on a small craft doing work and going back. It would be much easier and faster to go through someone's backyard. We haven't received all of the responses back yet, but that's pending.

Supervisor Sweeton – For the Boards information I will review all of the bids and put something together for the next meeting so we can make a decision and be consistent with our procurement policy.

SUPERVISORS REPORT

1. For the month of January, the Community Preservation Fund receipts were \$121,221.07 which brings the current fund back to \$2,839,502.82. We received word today from the NRCS which is the federal program that we are now authorized to go to closing on the Oprandy Farm which is one that should have been closed in 2018 but the feds had some issues internally that they have resolved. That has been cleared and it's a project that's funded 50% by the feds, 25% by the state and 25% from the community preservation. That will go to closing hopefully next week.

2. Wallkill River Flood Mitigation meeting with Sen. Metzger, I was unfortunately unavailable for that. This is the group headed by Orange County Soil and Water that included a bench project they had a grant from the state that created the bench to prevent the flooding along the Wallkill. They did a phase I and phase II and they met with Senator Metzger because she is now chair of the agriculture in the state and we wanted to bring her up to speed with black dirt issues and farms. It was a good meeting and they talked to her about Celery Avenue and the ledge removal and issues there and then continuing the benching west of Oil City Road on the Jersey side.

3. I want to mention to the Board and the public there is an effort that is being Coordinated by the Orange County Partnership and the Orange County Citizens Foundation called 17 Forward 86 Coalition. This is to get the state to deal with the issue of traffic on Route 17. They did a study under Senator Schumer that indicated the most cost-effective way was to add a third lane on 17. The DOT has allocated some more money to do some preliminary engineering on that project and this is a coalition to keep that moving so that it actually gets done and not continue to just be studied. People can check that out and if you want to join that effort, I know you can go onto www.17forward86.com and you will get updates.

4. Tree trimming and cutting along the roadways, I just want the residents to understand Orange & Rockland Utility which is our utility has a program with Nelson Tree in the area, cutting back and trimming trees. Our Highway Department shares a bucket truck with the Town of Wawayanda that we do trimming and cutting trees. We don't discriminatively cut trees just because we like cutting trees. We are doing this to preserve the utility lines and right-of-way's to safe travel the roads and people can hopefully understand that. Especially with this pattern we are in with a lot of heavy ice storms that bring down wires and poles and creates a lot of safety issues. Please understand what we are doing and if you have questions you can call the Department of Public Works or my office and you can talk about the work that's going on.

5. The journal entries were made with our Comptroller this week and everything was in order with that and all signed off.

Whereas, after comparing the thresholds contained in 6 NYCRR 617.4 and 5, the Town Board has determined that the proposed action is a Type 1 action, and

Whereas, after examining the EAF, the Town Board has determined that there are no other involved and/or federal agencies on this matter.

Now Therefore Be It Resolved, that the Town Board hereby declares itself Lead Agency for the review of this action.

Be It Further Resolved, that a Determination of Significance will be made at such time as all information has been reviewed by the Town Board to enable it to determine whether the action will or will not have a significant effect on the environment.

#R2019-72 SEQR - LOCAL LAW NO.1 OF 2019- AMENDING THE ZONING CODE OF THE TOWN OF WARWICK

Motion Supervisor Sweeton, seconded Councilman Gerstner to adopt the following resolution:

Whereas, the Town of Warwick Town Board is the SEQR Lead Agency for conducting the environmental review of a proposed set of Amendments to the Town Zoning Law, Town of Warwick, Orange County, New York, and

Whereas, there are no other involved agencies pursuant to SEQR, and

Whereas, the Town Board has reviewed an Environmental Assessment Form (EAF) for the action dated January 22, 2019, the probable environmental effects of the action, and has considered such impacts as disclosed in the EAF.

Now Therefore Be It Resolved, that the Town Board adopts the findings and conclusions relating to probable environmental effects contained within the attached EAF and Negative Declaration and authorizes the Supervisor to execute the EAF and file the Negative Declaration in accordance with the applicable provisions of law, and

Be It Further Resolved, that the Town Board authorizes the Supervisor to take such further steps as might be necessary to discharge the Lead Agency's responsibilities on this action.

Motion carried (5 Ayes, 0 Nays) Supervisor Sweeton declared this resolution duly adopted.

#R2019-73 ADOPT LOCAL LAW NO. 1 OF 2019 - AMENDING THE ZONING CODE OF THE TOWN OF WARWICK

Motion Supervisor Sweeton, seconded Councilman Gerstner to adopt a resolution to adopt a Local Law entitled "A Local Law No. 1 of 2019 entitled "Amending the zoning code of the Town of Warwick".

Motion carried (5 Ayes, 0 Nays) Supervisor Sweeton declared this resolution duly adopted.

Discussion: Supervisor Sweeton stated that this was introduced last fall with a public hearing left opened and extended where we took numerous comments regarding the issues of farm markets generally and activities that go there and the impacts on the neighborhood. We took that information and we made modifications to the zoning amendments that were originally proposed. We have reduced the sound level maximum from 75 decibels to 60 decibels which is in our performance standards. We defined the number of activities that can go on, it's not open ended anymore. We also required seasonal event permits for the larger farm markets that are going to have the larger events.

We've also purchased additional sound meters so our police department has one in every on-duty vehicle. They will be able to issue summonses for violations. I have met with all of the farmers to make them aware of the modifications made from the hearing. They are all agreeable to look for ways to be better neighbors and fit into the neighborhoods. We all are understanding that we need to preserve our farms and open space and give them the ability to diversify and stay in business. I think that's a community objective that's been in the comprehensive plan since before I was elected Supervisor and I think it behooves us to make these changes with the concerns incorporated and monitor it this coming season and see how everyone is working together. If we have to revisit this is, I think this is the way for us to be fair in this and put in some really sound compromises in the zoning and that's why I introduced this and why I believe that we should enact it this evening.
