**PRESENTATION:** Supervisor Sweeton and the Town Board presented the Warwick Valley Humane Society with a proclamation for the prevention of animal cruelty for the month of April, which reads as follows;

**PROCLAMATION - PREVENTION OF ANIMAL CRUELTY MONTH**

**WHEREAS,** the Warwick Town Board, the citizens of the Town of Warwick and the Warwick Valley Humane Society recognize that animals are living, sentient beings and, therefore, deserve due consideration and respect; and

**WHEREAS,** the welfare of animals consists of the Five Freedoms (freedom from hunger, thirst, and malnutrition; freedom from fear and distress; freedom from physical and thermal discomfort; freedom from pain, injury and disease; and freedom to express normal patterns of behavior); and

**WHEREAS,** the welfare of animals shall be a common objective and all appropriate steps shall be taken to prevent cruelty to animals and reduce their suffering with effective legal protection; and

**WHEREAS,** the vigorous enforcement of existing animal cruelty laws will hold those accountable for the neglect and abuse of any animal, wild or tame; and

**WHEREAS,** there is a proven direct correlation between acts of animal cruelty and violent and criminal acts on people; and

**WHEREAS,** the kind and humane treatment of animals has a strong correlation to the kind and humane treatment of people;

**NOW, THEREFORE, I, Michael P. Sweeton, Supervisor of the Town of Warwick, do hereby proclaim April 2019 “GO ORANGE for Animals in April – Prevention of Animal Cruelty Month” and call upon all residents to treat any and all animals with**

kindness, consideration and respect, and to report the abuse, neglect and cruelty of any animal to local law enforcement agencies or to the Warwick Valley Humane Society.

2. Arbor Day Celebration for the town is going to be on April 26<sup>th</sup> at 11:30 a.m. in conjunction with the Warwick Valley Gardeners. We appreciate them helping us with that and our Shade Tree Commission which is going to be held on Green Meadow Road off of Wheeler Road outside of Florida. There was a median in that development that was approved as part of its planning years ago and it's a town owned and maintained median. It was populated with ash trees and presented a hazard and our DPW removed them and we had the stumps ground down. Our Shade Tree Commission has put together a plan to replant it using a variety of trees as opposed to a monoculture that would be susceptible like the emerald ash bore, so those will be planted in advance and we will save one to be planted on April 26<sup>th</sup>. Hopefully you can make time to come out on the 26<sup>th</sup> at 11:30 a.m.

3. Household Hazardous Waste Day is this Saturday. It's a County run program that they do 4 times a year and this one is at Thomas Bull Memorial Park and it's free of charge to Orange County residents. You can drive up and bring your old pesticides and retail things in your closet that has expired and it's a great way to dispose of those.

**PRIVILEGE OF THE FLOOR (GENERAL)**

Susan Fierro - 49 Cascade Road, Warwick, NY 10990 - On March 30<sup>th</sup> we had an incident on our road with a resident discharging a firearm from 11:00 a.m. until 4:45 p.m., consistently minus the 15 minutes when the Warwick PD responded to find out what was going on. Many of the neighbors called the Police Department and we put in complaints to them to please investigate. Lieutenant Rader can probably better address how many calls went in between 11:00 a.m. and 2:00 p.m. The only time the firearm shooting stopped was when we presumed the Police Officer has visited this resident. This happened on a Saturday and it often happens on a Saturday and Sunday. I had no intent to step on this gentleman's 2<sup>nd</sup> amendment right, however for 5 hour and 45 minutes this man stepped on our inalienable right for life liberty and our pursuit of happiness. I call to your attention that I pulled your noise ordinance law and it addresses large devices, blasting and explosives, cabarets, dogs, parks, peace and good order, peddling and soliciting, public assemblies, entertainment and public safety. No where in here have I been able to find firearm discharging. In addition, I know your legislative intent that the Town of Warwick here by declares its intent to prevent unreasonably loud disturbing noises that are deemed to be detrimental to the life, health, welfare and good order of the people of the Town of Warwick. By this enactment the Town Board intends to promote the health, safety, moral and the welfare of the people of the town. Listening to gun shots for 5 hours and 45 minutes is enough to inflict all of us with PTSD. Not to mention I'm extremely concerned about the young children on our block being desensitized to the pop, pop, pop and in a crucial situation not being able to properly rectify in their heads what is going on and seeking cover. Now again, I call to your attention the fact that there are certain limits to reasonable and prudent people and that is this hypothetical person exercises average care, skill and judgement in conduct that society requires of its members for the protection of their own and others interest. Cascade Road echoes unbelievably and to hear this person discharging this firearm for this amount of time not only what sounds like a handgun, but semi-automatic firearms. It's extremely disturbing to us and we would like someone to address this and put an end to this noise ordinance. The Police Officer told me my only recourse is to come down here and talk to you about this. I tried to file a complaint and they told me no you can't file a complaint. This is his 2<sup>nd</sup> amendment.

Supervisor Sweeton – There's lots of issue there and we'll address all of that. If you can submit what you've got for the record so we can enter it and give the Clerk a contact number for you.

**Susan Fierro – Sure, absolutely I'll write that all down.**

**Supervisor Sweeton – Once I look into it I will be happy to try and see what can be done.**

**Councilman Kowal – How close was the discharging of firearms near residences?**

**Susan Fierro – I was told that he was firing to the back towards Long Creek and he was within those borders, however this is why they didn't do anything. I've investigated some of the firearm laws for New York State and semi-automatic rifles as long as they were manufactured before 1995 are still considered legal however, there's massive constraints the only people that are legally allowed to possess semi-automatic rifles are Police Officers, retired Police Officers and Military Personnel with strict approval of their commanding officers. He's number 90 approximately, I'm 49 and she's 52 and he's not more than a ¼ of a mile down the road from us and it's not the issue of him having target practicing, it's the issue of us having to put up with it for extended amounts of time.**

**Jean Macalaster – 52 Cascade Road, Warwick, NY 10990 - If he really wanted to shoot for that amount of time maybe he should consider going to a shooting range. You know Cascade you have mountains on both sides so any loud noises reverberate and it sounds so much more intense then it really is.**

**Susan Fierro - The Monroe Chester Hunting Club is 5.5 miles from the end of my driveway and Shop Rite is 5.2. I don't think this should be a concern for him going over there to shoot.**

**Supervisor Sweeton – Like I said let me look into the incident and try to get back to you with some information.**

**Susan Fierro – The other thing I did see which I should have brought up to the Officer however this investigation has only been going on with me for about a week and a half since they told me I had to come here. Prohibited noises 100A-3 of your noise code for the Town. The creation of any loud or raucous noise of unreasonable extent and duration which causes public inconvenience or alarm or disturbs the public's peace, comfort and tranquility. To me that's saying he's breaking the noise ordinance. There's another one in here that states, permitted noises under 100A-5 sounds on private property which do not carry beyond the boundary lines of the property which they are created. He's shooting on his property but it's offending the entire neighborhood.**

**Attorney Myrow – Is this just one day and one time?**

**Susan Fierro – Oh no he does this pretty often on Saturdays and Sundays and like I said he has his 2<sup>nd</sup> amendment rights but we also have our unalienable rights to life, liberty and the pursuit of our own happiness and this does not make us happy.**

**Jean Macalaster – He did not shoot this past Saturday. I don't know why, but he didn't. I know he moved in here 6 months ago and told his neighbor he likes to shoot. She said you need to let us know when this is happening because we like to roam our property and they like to go down by the creek and he's shooting in that direction. I know on Saturday the 30<sup>th</sup> he was shooting like Sue said at one point the noise had stopped and I'm assuming its when the Police Officer was there. When he restarted it sounded like he went further down by the creek because the gun shots didn't sound as close as they were before. Something changed after that period what it was, I don't know.**


**Supervisor Sweeton – We will look into it for you, just leave us a contact number for you.**
