DEBI YOUNG – President, Friends of Cascade Lake. Email dated May 16, 2022 to the Clerk regarding the progress made at Cascade Lake Park. Friends of Cascade Lake, Inc. (FOCL), with the assistance of DPW, continues to make progress with trail repairs. A land bridge from the eroded shoreline to the existing concrete dock area was built so that children and fisher people no longer have to use rotting pallets or other makeshift foot holds to cross the mud onto this popular, heavily used spot. FOCL also mowed a path through the grass to help park users avoid the need to walk through long grass now that the growing season is upon us. The largest section of eroded trail on the hill by the dam has been backfilled and now presents far less of a fall risk. This is a section where FOCL members have witnessed numerous children and older adults injure themselves. The remainder of the large "road" continues to be improved with DPW's heavy rock work and our creation of a wood chipped, pedestrian path along one side of the "road" so pedestrians can avoid the areas that continue to suffer damage caused by illegal, motor vehicle usage. FOCL has supplied a bucket and pick-up tool for park users to easily assist with litter collection. We have seen it in use! As the bears are active again, we appreciate that other park users are helping to collect the bear's messes. The new bench being donated by Walden Savings Bank has arrived at the bank. Stay tuned for proposed installation dates and news coverage requests. Trail blazing paint, brushes and templates have been acquired and will be in use in the near future. Additionally, we continue to collect donations and are beginning to pursue larger donors and grants. We will update you in more detail as these progresses.

COUNCILMAN DE ANGELO REPORT

1. The framing for the new shelter has begun for the Warwick Humane Society and

the 7 new kennels and 2 new isolation kennels are also underway. They are still in need of donations to their Capital Campaign Fund to be able to finish the facility.

2. Suzyn Barron wanted to let you know they picked up two stray dogs that were actually, abandoned by their owners. One is a 16-year-old short long hair retriever mix whose owner let him loose to die on his own. The dog is not dying, just old. The one is an American Staffordshire terrier mix with a case of possible contagious mange. She wanted me to remind everyone that animal abandonment is animal abuse and it's a misdemeanor crime in New York State.

3. They are continuing the \$3 Shelter Challenge hosted by Mary Esparra's Shelter Tails in honor of the original \$3 donated to the organization for helping a pigeon several years ago by a fixed income retired couple. To this date the challenge has raised over \$79,000 for the area shelters and donations can be made at wvhumane.org or sent to P.O. Box 61, Warwick.

4. Currently they have 7 dogs, 39 adult cats, 7 kittens, 2 rabbits, 2 horses with 5 dogs and 3 cats in foster care.

5. The Friendly Visitor Program as you may be aware of is transportation for older or disabled people with help grocery shopping, going to appointments, home visits and even talking on the phone. They are in need of volunteers and the volunteer training is happening on June 7th at 5:30 p.m. and June 23rd at 10:00 a.m. for more information you can call 845-986-1124 ext. 400. You can also find palm cards in our lobby and in lobbies around the town.

TOWN CLERK'S REPORT

Please be advised there has been an addendum made to the two bids for the Warwick Sanitary Sewer Plant No. 1 for the replacement of filter & sand filtration systems and to replace the ultra violet disinfection system. The amended bid packets can be found at the town of Warwick website, townofwarwick.org or in the Town Clerk's Office.

Supervisor Sweeton – That's part of our plan to upgrade the sewer plant that's reaching the end of its useful life so we need to upgrade a lot of the components and get that back to the shape it needs to be in, thank you.

SUPERVISORS REPORT

1. I just want to make a note that this is a Tuesday evening and normally our meetings are on the 2nd and 4th Thursdays. We had to move this one to Tuesday and the next one will be June 7th which is a Tuesday and then they will switch back to their regular 2nd and 4th Thursdays. I apologize for that change, but it is on our website and hopefully the papers can publicize it as well.

2. Community Preservation Fund Receipts for the month of April were \$138,812.28 which was a decent month and brings the total to \$7,301,498.18. We did receive recently an award from the State of New York for 75% match on a farm and we have 2 farms that are getting federal awards of 50% match. The program continues to grow and we have other farms we are evaluating and it's all good. We have about 4,300 acres under protection at the moment and I'm pretty sure when we get through this next round, we should be close to 5,000 acres under preservation which is a great accomplishment.

3. This coming Monday is Memorial Day. That is the time in this country where we Remember those who have paid the ultimate sacrifice of their lives in defense of the nation. We very proudly remember that on Monday in the Town of Warwick at 9:00 a.m. there will be a ceremony by the Polish Legion of American Veterans at the Pine Island Cemetery followed by a small service at their legion hall and in the Village of Warwick at 11:00 a.m. they will step off from Lewis Park and that will move down Main Street and up to the Warwick Cemetery where there will be a service and they will reconvene and move to the St. Stephens Cemetery where there will be another short service and down to Memorial Park where the Firemen will have a service. At 1:00 p.m. in the Village of Florida they will have a parade that will come back to their Veterans Memorial and they will have a service and at 2:00 p.m. at the Legion in Greenwood Lake on Lakes Road there will be a service held there. Everybody if you can take time out of your day to attend one of those and pay tribute and honor to those brave men and women, we would very much appreciate that.

4. The Warwick Story Share is going to be on Wednesday, June 1st and it will be posted on our website. This is an evening event at Wickham Woodlands Manor House. The idea there is residents can come and share a brief story with others hopefully begin dialog between people to generate a better understanding of people that live in our town and where they come from and their perspective on things. Which we don't get as much of anymore primarily due to social media and it's spearheaded by Beverly Braxton a longtime educator from the Warwick School District. She's a great person, a great facilitator and we hope this will be a beginning of people trying to understand others and positions and experiences that they had that maybe we have not had. We look forward to that.

5. Journal entries were made with the Comptroller for the Boards information and they have been double checked and signed off by me.
