**COUNCILMAN DE ANGELO REPORT**

**1. Chief Rader do you have anything to report?**

Police Chief Rader – The first junior league police academy class is full and we started advertising for the second one in August and that's filling up rapidly. We are also in partnership with the Warwick Coalition for a "National Day Out" to be held on August 2<sup>nd</sup> from 5:30 p.m. until 8:30 p.m. in Memorial Park. That is a night that the community can engage with law enforcement, first responders and other community members. There will be touch a truck, games, contests, prizes, food served and all in conjunction with the Coalition.

2. The Warwick Valley Humane has 7 new kennels and 2 new isolation kennels are being erected during the framing of the new facility and they are very pleased because this will give them 27 kennels in the shelter with the ability to isolate new intakes and special needs dogs.

3. June is "Adopt a Cat Month" and the Warwick Humane is offering ½ off of all adult cat adoption fees throughout the month. Adoption applications are available for download at [wvhumane.org](http://wvhumane.org).

4. It's kitten season, so they are having their annual kitten shower/open house on June 18<sup>th</sup> from 12 noon until 3:00 p.m. at their temporary location at 48 Ronald Reagan Blvd. in Merchants Square, Warwick. Their wish list for this event is small ceramic cat dishes, small cat beds, thermometers, non-automatic shut off heating pads, breeders edge foster care milk replacer, KMR powdered milk replacer, catnip toys, medium size exam gloves, small scratching posts/climbers and monetary donations for medications and vet visits.

5. They are hiring and they are seeking a full-time or part-time person interested in the welfare of animals. You must be 21 years or older with a clean drivers license and background and flexible schedule. The duties include animal care and rescue, and customer service with potential of 2 on call nights per week for animal emergencies. Contact the shelter at 845-986-2473 to set up a working interview.

6. They currently have 7 dogs, 39 adult cats, 22 kittens, 2 rabbits, and 2 horses at a boarding facility.

7. The Friendly Visitor Program is a transportation program for older or disabled people with help for grocery shopping, going on appointments, home visits and talking on the phone. They are in need of volunteers and volunteer training is happening on June 23<sup>rd</sup> at 10:00 a.m. and for more information you can call 845-986-1124 ext. 400. **PRIVILEGE OF THE FLOOR (GENERAL)**

Roger Showalter – Vice Chairman, Town of Warwick Planning Department – It came to my attention last night I have a few questions for the Board. I was unaware of the VRBO and Air B&B fee, explain what’s going to happen I heard a number of a \$1,000 or so. I think we brought this up a few years ago and at the time I was agreeable for a fee for inspection for a few hundred dollars. What brings about such a drastic rise in this fee?

Supervisor Sweeton – That was subject to a public hearing back in the beginning of the year and the reasoning is that the building applications coming before the town by nonresident homeowners. So, investors buying properties in Warwick and running them as rentals, so we decided that there were two things that needed to be done, because in residential neighborhoods not having a resident owner can be problematic. We’ve had multiple complaints from some Air B&B’s, so there were two things done. One was that we’ve limited the registration of an Air B&B to 2 by the single owner or a consortium that includes an owner that’s contiguous to both and we raised the fee to those nonresident owners to allow increased enforcement because it is a requirement that we get more

enforcement. The concept of Air B&B was if Roger Showalter has an extra room in his house and he needs to make a few bucks, he puts it out on Air B&B, he rents it, maybe you move out for a week visit your nephew and that's great for residents. We love it and we want to encourage it, so for those people, for those situations the fee did not change.

Roger Showalter – Good.

Supervisor Sweeton – Only for the fellow from Brooklyn no offense to Brooklyn, but who buys multiple houses and decides he wants to have a mini-Hotel 6. That's what it was about.

Roger Showalter – I'm agreeable to that Michael, I don't have a problem with it. I would like to see in the future that we as the Planning Board get this information. I didn't get this until last night, maybe we could get a packet monthly from the Town Board saying what's going on so we're not blindsided by something like that.

Supervisor Sweeton – Sure, happy to do that.

Roger Showalter – I would like to see that, that would be an improvement that we could do and I think it would make the board I serve on more effective. I'm not speaking for the board I'm speaking for Roger tonight because the board have their independent opinions. The second thing I want to address the Board with that I learned last night, there's something about food trucks, so tell me the attorney mentioned food trucks last night.

Supervisor Sweeton – Right now there's no regulation against food trucks other than what the health department requires. What we're seeing and we've watched this issue and we have an ordinance was a draft a couple of years ago when food trucks first got started. We haven't done anything with it, we're just watching the phenomenon. If you're for instance St. Stephen's and you're holding a food truck festival you have to get a special event permit from the Clerk's Office. What we're finding though is a farm market or a purveyor of spirits wants to have food but doesn't have a kitchen wants to have a food truck. Ok, it's not so much an issue because we want to encourage that but let's make sure it doesn't get out of hand, suddenly the purveyor of spirits has three food trucks and the restaurant down the street from them is now having an issue. I think we're watching it as we should and at the point that we decide to move forward with something we will certainly announce it, seek council and have a hearing on it. Right now, I think it makes sense in my own mind and I'm not speaking for the Board. I will give another instance, Drowned Lands Brewery not a farm market, so the way we viewed this in the past was if you're a farm market you could have a food truck there because it makes sense it adds to your experience as farm market and we encourage that. Drowned Lands Brewery is not a farm market, he's a brewery but he has a food truck, does it make sense there, yeah it might make sense.

Roger Showalter – It makes some sense Michael and with the alcohol being served and if there's a little food being served it might help people overcome too much alcohol.

Supervisor Sweeton – I think what we're trying to say is let's watch it and if maybe we need those food trucks to register so we know who is there and know that they have a health department license.

Roger Showalter – I think that would be the better way to go and I think the whole Board knows me well enough to how I feel about more regulations.


Supervisor Sweeton – Absolutely.

Roger Showalter – People in Albany love to regulate and I think we should be different than the people in Albany. We are the people of Warwick and I think we believe and prosper on freedom. I don't like excessive regulations however I don't disagree with watching the amount of food trucks. I don't think it's a problem for the soccer league or as a fundraiser. My wife, myself and family have gone down to St. Stephen's and supported that wonderful event. Approving of the food trucks sort of speak I think is a really good thing and I don't think it's going to hurt our restaurants if you have a food truck at the Drowned Lands for example. Not everybody is going to want to eat off of a food truck some will want to go after a few beers at the Drowned Lands they may want to go to Grappa or the Landmark or wherever they want to go. I think competition is good, I think it brings people choice and I don't disagree with looking at it and maybe monitoring it like you said. As a suggestion to the Board, I don't think we should jump into the pool of regulations right away. I do however think that it is good for the people being served that they are registered with the Health Department. That I can see and I'm ok with that because it is for people and it is food safety. You don't want people getting sick and hopefully it's good food and I think the food truck guy would want that because he doesn't want people to say it's no good. I don't think we should be excessively restrictive of competition because I think competition is good for everybody. I believe the more successful food trucks and restaurants and breweries and businesses in general in the Town of Warwick and in our County and State it washes down on all of us. If those guys are successful, it washes off onto us those food truck people or restaurant tours, I think it's good for all of us. I want it to be known on the record that I am not for excessive regulations.

Supervisor Sweeton – Absolutely, thank you Roger.


